### School Fees for 2023

We are pleased to inform our school families that there will be no increase in school fees for the 2023 school year. As South Australians continue to feel the impact of COVID-19, Catholic Education SA has announced it will freeze fees at its 86 Diocesan schools for the 2023 school year.

"These decisions are part of our continued COVID 19 response as we seek to support families at a time when they are being impacted by rising costs and inflation," says Dr Neil McGoran, Director, Catholic Education SA. Since 2019, Catholic Education SA has been implementing the *Making Catholic Education More Affordable Initiative* to ensure our schools are accessible to any family who wants their child to have a Catholic education. Dr Neil McGoran said the fee-freeze would not impact the quality of education. "We're committed to keeping school fees as low as possible and ensuring a Catholic education is affordable and accessible to all."

In addition to the fee-freeze, further fee remissions are available to any family who is struggling to pay school fees due to financial pressures. Families should contact Lucy Romano for more information.

On Wednesday, we celebrated Dr Rijken at Community Prayer. This was a time for our community to thank Dr Rijken for all he has done for Cardijn College Galilee over the last 3 years but also over the last 17 as Principal of Cardijn College. To wish Dr Rijken well, the students came up with the idea of farewelling him with a little part of Galilee, so each year group created him a present to take with him:

Playgroup: Handcrafted clay plant labels and playgroup activity packs for Dr Rijken's granddaughter.

Reception: A bead and shell decoration, like the ones that hang in the Secret Garden.

Year 1: Used their skills from a session with Bunnings earlier this year to create planter boxes with succulents in.

Year 2: Created an Herb and Sensory Garden with handmade labels, just like the Herb and Sensory Garden outside their Stage 1 classrooms.

Year 3: Wrote and illustrated a special recipe book based on their planting, harvesting and cooking sessions.

Year 4: A signed and decorated A garden shovel.





Year 5: Created an artist's impression map of the beautiful areas of our school along with handsewn frogs.

Year 6: Provided Dr Rijken, with his own yacca to take home, similar to the one he planted onsite, and also a beautiful book of their own water colours.

Year 7 & 8: Gifted some bush tucker plants in hand decorated pots for Dr Rijken to use in his home cooking.

Staff: Following the gifting of a kitchen garden from the students, garden hand tools and a Magic Square gardening book along with some local McLaren Vale wine were presented.

We shared that we hoped the gifts would be a reminder of how much Dr Rijken has meant to us here at Cardijn College Galilee and the legacy that he would leave behind. He will forever be a part of the history and fabric of our school and community, and we wish him every blessing as he begins his next chapter.

We think Ella, summed up what we think about Dr Rijken perfectly:

*"Praying about community is perfect for today.*

*We think Dr Rijken is very passionate about helping the community. And he is good at making sure everything is running smoothly.*
