Youth Environment Forum

On Tuesday, our Senior Environment Group attended the Southern Vales Environment Forum at Southern Vales Christian School, Morphett Vale. We had the opportunity to see a number of sustainable projects at the school and discuss next steps for our projects at Galilee. We thank Jeremy Gramp from Green Adelaide for organizing the day and Corey Turner from Warriparinga Arts and Culture Centre for supporting us with an Aboriginal art piece.

Reflections from the students:

Addi - On the tour I saw different bins for recycling cans, compost, soft plastics and waste.

Arella - I've had a really good learning experience and have some really good ideas for our community. I'm wanting to make some butterfly boxes and run a workshop about our butterfly garden.

Eva - It's inspired me to think of more creative ways to protect our environment and be sustainable like having a soft plastics area and emailing Coles to see if they are actually recycling the soft plastics we put in the bins.

Ollie - In the afternoon we created a story with Corey using Aboriginal symbols. My story is about a big storm that is coming in. The animals need to run away to a meeting place next to the watering hole.

Eva - I have 2 stories. My first one shows all the animals are coming to drink from the waterholes. They are coming from different parts and coming to share. It's been quite dry and there's lots of sandhills. They are coming out from where they have been. My second story is about a meeting place. All the people are coming to meet at the meeting place as a community. There are other animals around and it shows how they live in nature.

Magic Harvest update

Stage 2 students have been busy preparing the produce gardens for the new Spring/Summer planting Season. Compost and chicken poo from our very own Galilee chicken coop has been used to give the soil more 'food' to grow the next seasons' veggies. Manure has been added to our fruit trees and weeding has been completed in the garden beds. Students re-potted the succulents and sold as a fundraiser. They have decided to use the money to purchase seedlings for the new planting season. Students have also learnt how to make seed envelopes and used the Magic Harvest concept of 'Pass it on' to share with other students in our community.

Early Years

Recently the Early Years students celebrated their Eco-Literacy learning for the term. Over the term students have been improving the 2 worm baths in the Secret Garden as they needed some extra care. We have learnt that worms need:

- smaller scraps of food eg. apple cores not whole apples
- dry material including shredded paper, dry leaves

When we take care of the worms, they take care of us by providing worm castings which we can use in our garden beds.
