
Uniform






















Being calm in the storm

Last week Catholic School Parents South Australia presented a seminar by Madhavi Nawana Parker – 'Anxiety and Worry'. Madhavi is the director of Positive Minds Australia and has written many books about development of social skills, resilience, and wellbeing.

It was lovely to gather with some parents to watch the online event. Madhavi discussed how anxiety is one of the hardest human emotions and can be just as uncomfortable for the children as it can be for parents and carers. She reminded listeners that the goal in helping your child is not to rescue them, and for them to never experience anxiety. Anxiety is a part of life; the goal is to raise children with a sense of confidence and competence to know they can deal with it.

She reminded listeners to say as little as possible when a child is elevated, they need your empathy, compassion, support, and optimism to help them to see their worry separate from who they are. She spoke of the importance of teaching children to solve their problems and when they come to us with a problem or concern ask, 'What are you going to do about it?'

Madhavi presentation was honest and real, and she reminded listeners that there are no perfect parents only real parents and that you know your family and your child and can find a way that works for you. She spoke about a framework of thinking around development of competence, connection, character building, development of coping skills, contribution to society, control, and courage as ways to support a child's growth.
