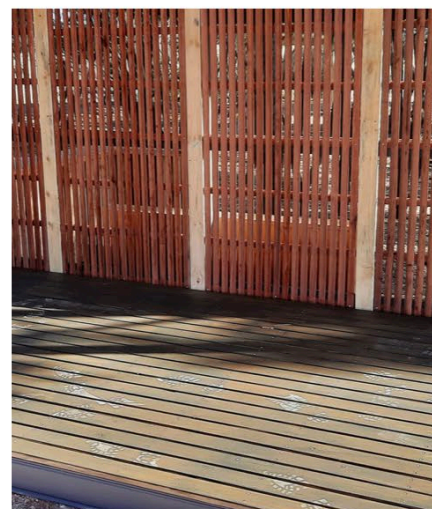
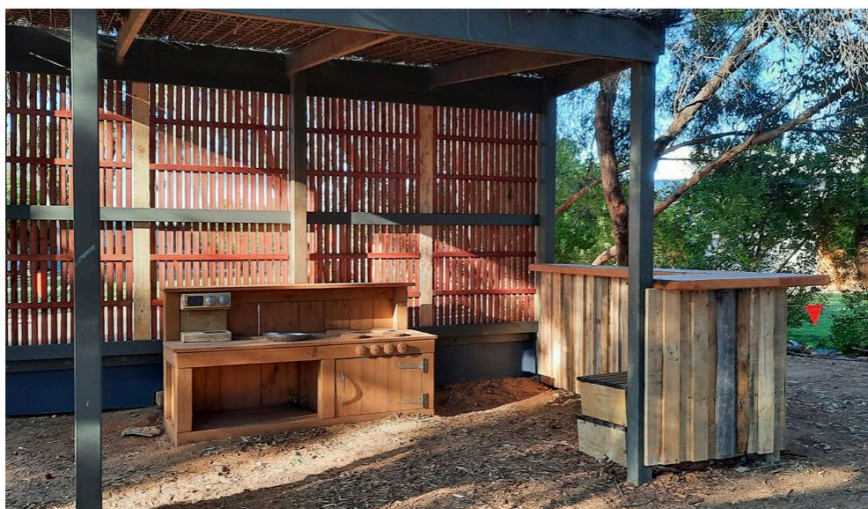
Harriet – I am going to make yummy cupcakes!
