The gift of friends



The 30th of July every year is International Day of Friendship. The International Day of Friendship was proclaimed in 2011 by the United Nations General Assembly with the idea that friendship between peoples, countries, cultures, and individuals can inspire peace and build bridges between communities. During school, children go through many stages of making friends and along the way they will experience conflict at some stage. It is very normal for children to experience conflict from time to time as this a way of children discovering what works with friends and what doesn't.

If your child does experience conflict, this is a wonderful teaching moment to guide them and help them learn about how to get along with others. Sometimes children can resolve conflict themselves, but they may need guidance, and emotional support. The best way to give support is to use 'reflective listening'. When using this type of listening, we listen to the content of what your child is saying and listen for the emotion and then we reflect what they are saying e.g., "it sounds as though that really frustrated you when you did not get to play your game". We can then try to help them problem solve the situation by giving them lots of opportunities to brainstorm a solution without stepping in too early to solve it for them.

We can look at conflict as a negative emotion, but it is good to remember that conflict teaches children, to compromise, to solve problems, builds empathy, teaches us how get along in a group and to develop successful, loving, and healthy relationships as adults.

If you have any concerns about a conflict or friendship issue your child may experience, please speak with your child's home room teacher. At Galilee campus we also have a wellbeing team who may be able to help including Merenia Vince (chaplain), Gabriele Catania (counsellor), Rachel Bishop (learning enrichment coordinator) and myself who support teachers supporting the needs of all students and families. So please let us know if you have any questions or concerns.
