Dear Parent/Carers,

Throughout the day today our homegroups have gathered in the church with their stage to reflect on the symbol of 'ash' and the meaning of this season we call Lent.

Premier's Reading Challenge

At Cardijn College Galilee, we highly value literacy and love helping our students develop a love of reading. One of the ways we do this is through participation in the Premier's Reading Challenge. The Premier's Reading Challenge is a literacy engagement program designed to encourage students to read more books and enjoy reading! The first reading challenge was held in 2004. It is a fantastic way to develop a love of reading for leisure, pleasure and learning through quality literature.

The Challenge requires students to read 12 books between the beginning of the school year and early September. This year we are aiming for 100% student participation in the challenge.

Students from Reception to Year 6 will be required to read 8 books from the extensive Premier's Reading Challenge booklist at an appropriate literacy level. They may read 4 books of their own choice. Students in Year 7 are required to read 4 books from the Reading Challenge booklist then select 8 books of their own choosing.

All students who participate in the Challenge will receive an award from the Premier, either a certificate or a medal.

voraciously reading
fascinated with a particular genre
looking for a new genre to try
enjoying reading for pleasure
not yet enjoying reading for pleasure
never without a book
never with a book
reading widely
not reading widely
... then the Premier's Reading Challenge
is just for them!




