#### **Building work**

Finally, after mentioning the build back in Term 1, the initial construction stages of the new building have begun. Horizon Construction Services are our builders and will be working on the construction of the new building, fence along Quinliven Road and the new entrance to the car park over the next 10 months. It is a really exciting time with the builders beginning their work and delivering the design from the architects – Tridente Boyce. As you will have noticed access to our site has changed a little with only vehicular and pedestrian access via a new entrance south of the old car park entrance on How Road. I ask for your patience and cooperation while these works are in place. I also ask that cars are not parked on the nature strip outside the builder's compound or the car park as this causes congestion and is dangerous for pedestrians walking to the How Road crossing, and can also attract a parking fine from council inspectors. Safety, as I am sure you will agree, is paramount to all of us in the community.

#### Class Placements

Class placements have begun in earnest. We use a variety of information to place students into classes. Please remember that as we move to single year classes in 2022, we will be splitting students into one of two possible classes from Reception to Year 6.

#### **Reception 2022 Transition**

Over the last few weeks, Cardijn College Galilee have welcomed 34 new Reception 2022 students to the school through our transition programme. The children have been learning about school as they listen to Mrs Gregory read stories, play games and teach songs and take them on walks to familiarise them with the school. We believe that these visits help the students to develop confidence and settle into school successfully in preparation for next year. They will continue to transition into school on Thursdays for the rest of this term. It has been great for me to be involved with this and to see the children's smiling faces as they transition into our community.



# Healthy, thriving learners

#### **Drink Bottles**

Recently we have noticed an increase in the number of students coming to school without a drink bottle. As we know our body is made up of approximately 70 percent water and our body loses water throughout the day. For children, the amount of water needed will vary depending on the amount of activity they do, the weather temperature, and their diet and health. As a general guide, children up to 8 years of age should have a minimum of 4-5 cups of water a day. Children above 8 years old require at least 6-8 cups of water a day. Due to COVID restrictions water fountains cannot be used. As the weather gets warmer, it is very important to make sure **your child is bringing a drink bottle filled with water to school each day.** When children are thirsty, they get tired. In fact, studies show that not replenishing the body with water is the number one trigger of daytime fatigue. Children need water to help them to focus and support learning.

#### Outdoor Classroom Day 4th November

Outdoor Classroom Day is a global campaign to celebrate and inspire outdoor learning and play. On the day, thousands of schools around the world take lessons outdoors and prioritise playtime. Outdoor learning improves children's health, engages them with learning and leads to a greater connection with nature. Play not only teaches critical life skills such as resilience, teamwork, and creativity, but is central to children's development. At Cardijn College Galilee we are fortunate to have many opportunities to learn in and with our beautiful outdoor environment! As the weather improves take time to spend time in nature with your child and enjoy improved health, well-being, and happiness.
