Classroom Pulse Check In

In week 5/6 of each term every student in Catholic Education participate in a Classroom Pulse Check In Survey. The survey has been developed to find out how students are currently feeling about their experience in school. It is tailored to allow staff to check in and provide immediate feedback and support to the students.

What does it ask?

The survey asks students eight questions related to identity, learning, relationships and belonging.

There are two versions of the survey: Reception to Year 3 where students respond by clicking on emoji's and a Year 4 to Year 12 where students respond by clicking on three possible responses. The options are "Most of the time," "Sometimes" and "Not very often."

The data can help the school

Not only does the Check In assist staff to understand student perspectives on their experience in school, but it also enables us to identify trends at particular times of the year when students require greater pastoral care.

Listening to children's questions

At the start of the year our new Reception children often make a special visit to the church with their teachers. They take time to look around, wonder, become familiar with the space, and are provided time to ask their questions. And they have a myriad of questions in this space!

They have questions about the 'oils for healing' *(Elliot)* in the church and think the blessing with oils is a positive gift to those who are unwell. They notice the beautiful glass baptismal font, and, in their wisdom, they associate the sign of the cross with the understanding that 'Jesus loves us always and is in nature and our hearts'. They theorise that 'when we think about Jesus, that puts him in our hearts'. *(Lincoln)*

The students are certainly being curious about their own spiritual selves and the faith community and have real enthusiasm for learning about ritual, symbol, story and community. We continue to foster their questions, and critical and creative thinking as essential in learning about the faith community and the big life questions they bring.
