Calming Benefits of Nature

On 5th of June each year we celebrate World Environment Day. At Galilee we are fortunate to have developed our beautiful grounds with the children to explore, learn, play and respect. We know that there is extensive research that demonstrates spending time in nature improves the mental health of children and adults.

The opportunity to be aware and reflect is something we need to make more time for in a technological world. It is very important to take time to 'chill' and breathe. Nature and earth are the one thing that connects humans all around the world.



Being in nature can:

- improve your mood
- reduce feelings of <u>stress</u> or <u>anger</u>
- help you take time out and <u>feel more</u>
 <u>relaxed</u>
- improve your physical health
- improve your confidence and <u>self-esteem</u>
- help you <u>be more active</u>
- help you make new connections

Research from the Journal of Paediatric Nursing found "access to natural environments can benefit children in various ways, including improvements in confidence, social interactions, cognitive development, academic achievement, and emotional wellbeing" (McCormick, 2017).

Some ideas that you could incorporating into your family routines, are walking in nature, creating something inspired by nature, sit outside (relax and be mindful), read a book outside, prepare seasonal food or observe the birds.

As the nights grow colder and leaves fall from the trees remember to appreciate the benefits from being active and outside in nature.
