### Transitions

For some students, adapting to new learning environments and change is stressful. This could mean starting or leaving primary or secondary school, moving schools, moving house, or changing year levels or even re-joining school after an absence. While, these transitions can bring exciting opportunities, some children and young people, and their families, can find these changes difficult and can lead to worry and stress or even disengagement. Learning communities often spend a lot of time preparing and thinking about these transitions.

Transitions in schools require students to adapt to new circumstances. The experience is different for everyone, and some students, and their families, need extra support. There are many ways that educators and families can support students make positive transitions, including by identifying when support is required, and how to access and offer support. For any transition, good communication and understanding the needs of everyone involved is very important. Parents and caregivers can support teachers by reinforcing positive messages to children about their school experience. Listening to their children, giving them opportunities to discuss what they are looking forward to as well as what they might be concerned about. This can also be an ongoing conversation after the school year has started so if any issues arise during the first days and weeks, please ensure your child's homeroom teacher is aware. We are here to support you.

If your child is anxious when considering transitions:

- Discuss and normalise common worries/concerns
- Take time to prepare find out what your child needs to be prepared (uniform, food, books etc)
- Review and rehearse strategies for making friends
- Let them know they can talk with someone about it
- Take time to discuss what children want to improve and what they would like to learn next year and celebrate their achievements this year.
- Talk to someone at school and seek support
