Each morning all home groups take part in a morning welcome. This routine looks different according to the age and needs of each home group, but the primary purpose of this welcome is to support each child to establish connection.

We make sense of our learning by connecting with what is around us, where we are and who we are with. This welcome develops a sense of emotional safety in the context of establishing the home room community. It brings people together, supports relationships and creates connections. Creating connections is more than a lone process but a process involving all of the community.

Thus, it is very important children are on time each morning and establish a positive learning culture at the beginning of the day.

It is a whole school approach that fits in to the rhythm of a day. At Cardijn College Galilee we believe welcome is first and foremost to being community. The research shows that belonging to a school is key to well-being and achievement as is connection within the family. Belonging starts with the way we welcome each and every one!


The ECA (Early Childhood Australia inc.) booklet *Nurturing the spiritual child:* Compassion, connection and a sense of self names key components in nurturing the spirituality of young children including:

- · Valuing 'being' in the present and learning more about themselves as unique and loved
- Connecting and relating this includes encouraging children's questions about the faith tradition and its possible meaning in their lives
- Cultivating compassion this requires developing imagination, empathy, and care for others

Spiritual development can lead to a more socially just world, opportunity and equality for all. By promoting spiritual development, in addition to traditional domains of learning such as literacy and STEM, educators create a more peaceful and just society while raising children who are prepared to participate in society in positive ways.

Through spiritual development, children learn to be aware of and comfortable with qualities such as respect, responsibility, and reverence for self and others. They learn to acknowledge differences between people without feeling fear. They develop a love for the earth and take action to protect it. And in our context here at Galilee, they have the opportunity to explore symbol and ritual that can provide meaning and connection.
