Lego based therapy is a social development program that uses Lego activities to support the development of a wide range of social skills within a group setting. Lego club is more than playing with Lego. The club provides a highly structured environment where everyone plays a specific role within the group. Playing with Lego in a therapy setting promotes social interaction, turn-taking skills, sharing, collaborative problemsolving and the learning of concepts. It can be used to target goals around social skills, language and motor skills.

FIRST NATIONS EDUCATION

Karno Martin visits term 3

Karno Martin will be visiting Galilee each fortnight this term to work with various Homegroups to discuss First Nation Education. Last week the Year 6 Homegroups gathered to chat with Karno about The Dreaming as part of their Religion lessons.

Max W – Karno talked about Totems. Totems are part of the Dreaming stories and are part of Aboriginal culture. He talked about a couple of Dreaming stories.

Pearson – Karno explained where the areas of the Aboriginal Countrys are. He explained how the continents were altogether and then they came apart because of the ice ages. When the ice melted the water rose over the land.

Dehklan – I liked hearing Karno talk about Totems. I think I have a Totem but I don't know it yet. He was talking about how people turn into animals in the Dreaming stories. It was really interesting.











Bring Back the Butterfly Project - Year 6

This term the Year 6 Homegroups are participating in the 'Bring Back the Butterfly Project' during their Eco literacy lessons.

Ms Gould joined us during our first lesson and shared the story of Galilee's original Butterfly Garden that she help to create with students and families in 2007.

Students will be working with experts from Green Adelaide and the Australian Association for Environmental Education, to research, plan and create this outdoor learning space. Students will be planting a range of Indigenous plant species to provide both nectar and host plants to encourage butterflies to the area.

Challenge

This year Galilee students from R-6 are registered to be part of the **Premiers Be Active Challenge.** The aim is to encourage students to be more active more often and to improve student health and wellbeing.

Galilee students will be participating in the challenge and recording physical activity for 4 weeks beginning;

Monday July 29th – Monday August 26th

Challenge Requirements:

The challenge requires students to do at least 60 minutes of physical activity on at least 5 days of the week.

To meet their daily requirement, students should undertake moderate to vigorous physical activity. Examples include riding a bike, playing tag games, dancing, playing sport, PE lessons, play time activity or walking to or from school. Physical activity does not need to be in one block of 60 minutes – it can be shorter amounts of activity that add up to 60 minutes.

Students record their physical activity on the relevant student recording booklets.

- Years R-2 will keep their booklets at home for the 4 weeks.Parents/Caregivers will help to fill out the booklet and return to school by Wednesday 28th August.
- Years 3-6 will keep them at school and fill out when directed by their teachers.

Students who complete their 4 weeks of activity and submitted their booklets to their homeroom teacher will receive a medal of participation. Each year they can work towards higher levels of medals, similar to the Premiers Reading Challenge.
