This week we celebrate the Feast of All Saints and the Feast of All Souls, which are significant feast days in the Catholic liturgical calendar. On All Saints Day we remember a long line of people who have lived their lives with compassion, justice and love. On All Souls Day we remember and pray for those who have died, especially our loved ones who have passed away. Both of these days connect us through our love and communion with God and with others and we are called to remember the community to which we all belong.

Did you know that the tradition of Halloween actually came from these Christian celebrations? The word 'hallow' in the English language actually means 'Saint' and we use this word in the Our Father prayer when we say "Hallowed be your name", meaning Jesus' name is to be held holy. Originally in our Catholic tradition, all significant feasts began their celebrations with a vigil on the night before and people would prepare with acts of prayer and fasting. Over time this celebration on the eve of All Saints Day became known as 'All Hallows evening' which was shortened to 'Halloween'.

However, this tradition has changed over time, introducing scary characters and the tradition of trick or treating. The origin of scary things most likely came from the Celts, who would celebrate the festival of the Lord of the dead and the tradition of trick or treating is likely to have come from the farmers who would go door to door collecting food for the village feast and it was believed that giving to this brought you good luck.

At Galilee, as a Catholic School we celebrate the Feast of All Saints by having a mass for our older students and a focus on this feast in our Community Prayer. On Tuesday the Middle School students celebrated this mass, where Father Dominick reminded us that we are all called to be saints in our lives, by showing love and kindness, being compassionate and helping those in need and by praying for our friends and loved ones. The Feast of All Souls is acknowledged with our Remembrance books, which are in the staff room and in the church. If you, or your child would like to add the name of a loved one in the book, the church will be open on Monday morning and afternoon, for families to add the names of any loved ones who have passed away to be with God.

Please encourage your child to come along each Thursday 2nd Outside learning. The timetable of weekly activities and locations is displayed in each building.

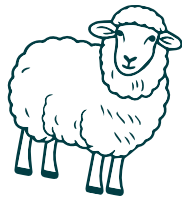
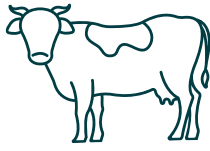
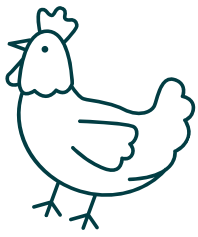
