TRIBUTE TO MISS RUTH GEORGE

It is with regret that we have learnt of the recent death of Miss Ruth George, one of the Honorary Life Members of the MLTAQ.

Before studying at the University of Queensland, Miss George attended the Ipswich Girls’ Grammar School. During her university years she lived at The Women’s College and always remained an interested member of the Old Collegians’ Association. Miss George majored in French and English at the University and graduated in 1923. She was a member of the University Music Society and enjoyed the society’s memorable re-union last year.

Miss George’s first teaching appointment was at the Rockhampton Girls’ Grammar School. Then followed her long career at Somerville House, where she was a resident mistress and became First Assistant.

Miss George was very actively engaged in the English Association as well as the Modern Language Teachers’ Association. She also led a literary circle for the Australian Federation of University Women (Queensland).

During her overseas travels Miss George spent a considerable period of time in France. It was because of her extreme dedication and contribution to the teaching of French in Queensland that the MLTAQ conferred on her the honour of life membership of the association.

Miss George was a person of very high ideals, and to her relatives and friends we extend our sincere sympathy.

LifeMembers- The late Sister Mary Borgia RSM

4th March 1972

The following quote was found in the 1968 MLTAQ Publications:

“Sister Mary Borgia has, for some years, carried out the administrative work of the MLTAQ. All members wish her well, and will no doubt express pleasure at the fact that we are still able to call on her wisdom and experience, since she has undertaken to remain a member of the Executive of the Committee.”

Below is the eulogy that was delivered by Sr M Borgia’s nephew, Denis Stark on 5 September 1998.

This is a happy day, for Ellen May Battaglone - Sr Mary Borgia has joined her God. I probably owed Aunt Nell more than anyone else and she asked me to say some words on this occasion.

Sr M Borgia (“Borg” to generations of students and Sisters, but Nelly or Aunt Nelly to her family members and numerous nieces and nephews) was born on 28.5.07 in Toowoomba of Irish/Italian stock. She was the fourth child and third daughter in the family of 10 children of Giulio Battaglini and Mary Coonan.

Her early education was at a number of small country schools, followed by a period at St Saviour’s Convent in Toowoomba.

She began her life’s work of teaching at St. Saviour’s as “pupil Teacher” in 1926. She delighted in recounting that she returned home for a period after this and, while she professed her Vocation was secure, she enjoyed this period of life immensely, telling, 70 years later, of Gus, who had met with her father’s disapproval but whom she still remembered in her prayers.

But the Convent won. Nelly entered the Convent of the Sisters of Mercy on 16 July 1929. This period of life before the Convent no doubt prepared her well for a better and broader understanding of her students at a time when this was often lacking.

Her entry to the convent and All Hallows’ teaching staff in July 1929 as a sub-junior Teacher preceded her profession as a Sister of Mercy in January, 1932. This was the beginning of 50 years of teaching at All Hallows’. Her academic qualifications and awards began in 1928 - Class 3 Teacher. This was a humble beginning for a very talented Teacher, linguist, poet and artist. Her B.A. followed in 1935, Dip. Ed. (Philosophy & Logic) 1937, B.Ed., 1938 and ATCL Speech, 1938.

Her years of teaching involved a prolonged and continuing love of the classics. Latin, English, French and later German were her principal domains. At times, logic, mathematics and history were added. German was a later love and in her sixth decade she added a Postgraduate Certificate from the University of Queensland. But she waited until the age of 68 years to be awarded a scholarship to Munich, Germany, in 1975, where she was awarded a Diploma from the Goethe Institute.

It was fitting that her final academic achievement at the age of 71 years was a Diploma in Christian Spirituality Leadership. She was appointed to State and University Educational advisory boards and

associations too numerous to detail. Honorary and Life memberships, including that of the Modern Language Teachers' Association were awarded.

She was proud to have three generations in a number of families at All Hallows' and at times compared attributes and abilities of these generations. She had an enlightened approach to discipline, recognising her own foibles - "they thought I was a bit of a dreamer"...

As an enlightened nun, when many were not, she did not fully embrace the liberalisation of the order in latter years. All Hallows' was her home, her life and her love for most of her 69 years as a nun. She was interviewed at the time of All Hallows' 125th Anniversary celebrations stating that she hoped the "quality and culture she associated with All Hallows' would not be lost".

Aunty Nell remained a strong family member throughout her years. Her sisters and brothers and their families were very close. She did as much as she could to assist them from her cloistered existence. She unashamedly recycled gifts. Her sisters awarded her religious life by remembering both her feast day and her birthday. Her niece, Judy, has continued to provide her with the necessary cakes for both. Other nieces continued their mothers' provision of other requisites.

Aunty Nell was a very special person. Very brilliant, with unlimited time to help and encourage scholarship and learning. She had an enquiring mind, which endured the years and made her an interesting and challenging person to visit. There was often a touch of roguery just beneath the surface, which was not usually expected in a nun. Undoubtedly her pride was her least nunnish characteristic, persisting into her tenth decade, and stories abound regarding her concern for her appearance (clothes, shoes, teeth, etc) even into her 90's.

Her deep and unswerving faith remained until the end. She did much to develop spirituality and faith in others through her teaching[s] and her example. Her abilities as a poet, artist and linguist all enabled her better to give glory to her God. She has been ready to join God for a number of years. I feel her faith was well expressed in her poetry and, in conclusion, I quote from her poem " Light of the World", inspired by the light streaming through the All Hallows' chapel window, which I feel summarises many of her thoughts:

*O lovely light, you lead our thoughts above
To where no lamp, no sun, no moon will be
For Christ the Lord will be the light thereof
And we'll rejoice in Light for all eternity.*

Life Members- The late Professor Keith Leopold

12th August 1979

Keith Leopold, an only child, was born on 30 July 1920 to a family of both German and Australian-Scottish background. He was brought up in Maitland, receiving his secondary schooling at Maitland Boys' High School. On completing the NSW Leaving Certificate he was part of the 1938 intake at Armidale Teachers College. He was awarded a scholarship to the newly established New England University College.

In 1940 he transferred to the University of Sydney and at the end of 1942 completed an Arts degree with First Class Honours and the University medal in German. After almost two years in Australian Special Intelligence he was released from the army to become a Diplomatic Cadet in the fast-growing Department of External Affairs.

At the end of 1945 an offer from the University of Sydney made him decide that an academic career was preferable to a diplomatic career. He spent 1946 teaching in the German Department of the University of Sydney and the next year was appointed Lecturer in German at the University of Queensland, and in his own words, taught "everything from Old High German to the most recent Thomas Mann novel".

Keith Leopold's efforts soon brought tangible results: the Department grew from a mere handful of students to become, in the 1960's, the largest German Department in Australia. He attributed this growth above all to the enlightened attitude of the State Department of Education at that time to the teaching of foreign languages to the untiring efforts and dedication of the staff in the German Department, especially his colleague and friend, Dr Gunther Bonnin. All who have worked with Keith Leopold, however, know that the rise of the study of German to real prominence in Queensland was primarily due to his unwavering promotion of his field, not only at the University but especially also in schools throughout

Queensland: his visits to country centres and his "sights and sounds" lectures on German culture and attended by enthusiastic audiences of country students and their Teachers.

In 1959, together with Professor Mahoney, he was instrumental in forming the Modern Language Teachers' Association of Queensland. Professor Mahoney became the foundation President and Dr Leopold and Mr Don Munro were Vice-Presidents.

He soon became Head of the Department of German at the University of Queensland and his contribution to German studies was acknowledged by the university through the offer of the Chair in German in 1964. This led to the award by the German Government of the Verdienstkreuz 1.Klasse to Professor Leopold

in 1973. He remained Head of the German Department until his retirement in 1985.

In the course of his 39 years at the University of Queensland he also gained knowledge of the universities of Tübingen, Cologne and Hamburg. His publications include numerous articles on language and literature, a series of language texts in German and French and three novels in English. His textbook *Introducing German* was used by students and Teachers of German for many years, as were his school readers. For many people who did not know him personally, Keith Leopold was none the less a household name, thanks to these publications, used widely in Queensland schools.

German studies grew rapidly in the state, gaining further impetus through the annual Goethe Poetry Competition for Secondary School Students, inaugurated by Keith Leopold, and still going strong and currently attracting almost 2000 entries.

He regularly came as Guest of Honour to MLTAQ German Camps. It really impressed the students to meet the author of books they were studying at school. When language study was no longer compulsory for an Arts degree, Professor Leopold organised German Quiz nights at the University. This helped promote German in schools. He was also responsible for many ABC Radio German programs, *German for Schools*, all written by Keith Leopold.

Since his retirement he lived very quietly (a widower) in the Brisbane suburb of Paddington. His many friends - students, colleagues and Teachers - remember him with fondness and mourn his passing on 13th July 1999.

LifeMembers- The late Mr Robert McDonell

12th August 1979

Bob McDonell was a dynamic Teacher of Italian, the teaching of which he promoted through his work both in schools (both State and Private) and for the Dante Alighieri Society.

As a Teacher at the Dante School over many years, he introduced many new courses. He was a foundation member of the Dante Alighieri Society (1952) and later became Vice President and President, before becoming life member of the Society on 14 January 1969.

Bob McDonell was the first person to introduce Italian into State schools in Queensland. He organised Saturday morning classes at All Hallows' Convent to train Teachers of Italian. He arranged concerts for students of Italian and in 1970 organised the first Italian Verse Speaking Competition, open to students throughout the State. He was also the editor of popular Italian magazines for schools.

He was Italian convener for the MLTAQ for several years, always organising or supporting Italian activities.

He passed away in 1988.

Life Member - Professor David Ingram

25 June 1983

Professor David Ingram has contributed superlatively to Language Teachers' Associations at State, National and International levels, contributions which show unrivalled commitment in an increasingly complex arena. The following is, consequently, only a minimal reflection of his activities.

During his career, which spans four decades, he has taught in all sectors: primary, secondary and tertiary, both in Australia and abroad.

Professor Ingram's contributions to language policy, testing and assessment of proficiency in Languages and ESL are of world fame. He has published extensively in the above and other areas in Australia and overseas, has been invited to present papers and conduct research in many countries and has represented Australia in many significant events and activities in Australia and abroad.

He was a long-serving member of the MLTAQ, as the following outline of his roles on the Executive Committee shows:

From 1982 to 1996, Professor Ingram was President of the AFMLTA, the Australian Federation of Modern Language Teachers' Associations, after successfully editing *Babel* (1974), being Vice President (1981-1982) and representing the MLTAQ on the AFMLTA Council (1977-1982).

During his Vice Presidency of FIPLV, the Fédération Internationale des Professeurs de Langues Vivantes, Professor Ingram elevated the image and role of the Australian Language Teachers' Associations, commanding the respect of international colleagues and especially within the region of Asia and Oceania.

The respect he earned among professional language educators is evident in the numerous requests for his participation in many august bodies, such as the Australian Languages and Literacy Council.

Apart from continuing an active role as member of numerous committees, David is currently Professor of Applied Linguistic and Director of the Centre for Applied Linguistics and Languages in the Faculty of Asian and International Studies at Griffith University.

Life Member – the late Miss Zillah Bunn

23rd July 1988 - ? 2006

As a student, Zillah Bunn attended the very first meeting of the MLTAQ and was a member of the Association's Executive for many years.

She held the position of Vice President from 1977 to 1983 and was President from 1984 to 1986.

A tower of strength to all on the Executive, Zillah was always willing to assist others, quietly and confidently helping to organise whatever was on the MLTAQ agenda. In the early days, activities in which she assisted ranged from helping Bev Bonning with the first National Conference at the Parkroyal to offering support with the MLTAQ-Courier Mail LOTE Competition, when the entries were too many to fit into the Kedron State High School Hall.

Zillah was also prominent in the organisation of various Camps, an activity in which she encouraged many of her students to take part. She was also a regular contributor to publications with advice especially useful for young, inexperienced Teachers.

Furthermore, Zillah was chairperson of the BSSSS State Panel for German for a number of years. She was Deputy Principal at Wynnum State High School until she retired in 2005??.

Life Member - Barbara Clarke

17 August 1999

Barbara Clarke was a member of the MLTAQ Inc Executive for seven years.

During this time, she filled the following roles of German Convener (1984 - 1986) and President (1987 - 1990) on the Executive.

As German Convener, Barbara worked tirelessly to organise student and Teacher activities, in particular the camps and Oktoberfests. With her keen interest in German and organisational skills, she successfully promoted German in Queensland.

As President, she strove to highlight the concerns of Languages Teachers and increase the profile of Languages in the Community. Barbara has been a German Teacher, Head of Department (LOTE), Secondary Deputy at MacGregor and Holland Park State High School, as well as working for two years in the Languages and Cultures Unit in the initial stages, especially with the production of the Stage A Kits in five languages. She is presently a Deputy Principal at Mansfield State High School.

Bruce Downie has been a member of the MLTAQ ^{Inc} Executive since 1975, where he has been active in the following roles:

He has been a member of the German Standing Committee, and also on the Committee that initiated the Student Camp concept. He has been involved with these camps ever since. He has been either Assistant Cook or Chief Cook for the German Student Camp for the whole of its 24 years, catering for over 100 people for the weekend.

Bruce instigated Language Weekends for Teachers of all languages and organised several of these at Binna Burra and Mount Tamborine.

As Treasurer he had considerable input into restructuring of the association's finances. In his role as Inservice Officer he organised many activities involving Language Advisors for all languages at The Gap State High School where the MLTAQ Resource collection was initiated.

Bruce has been a Teacher of German and Head of LOTE Department. He was Head of Department LOTE at The Gap State High School for 18 years.

Among his other functions, he was a member of the BSSSS (now QSA) Brisbane/Ipswich District Review Panel for German and in the 1980s was a District Leader for the Queensland Education Department.

He is currently President of the Queensland Goethe Society.

Life Member - Roger White

19 July 1999

Roger White was a member of the MLTAQ ^{Inc} Executive for 17 years. His roles on the Executive Committee included: Assistant Secretary (1974), Newsletter Editor (1975 - 1976), Publicity Officer (1977 - 1979), Treasurer (1980 - 1984) and Vice President (1987 - 1991).

In addition to these roles, Roger was also, as Japanese Convener and Teacher of Japanese, the key to all aspects of student and Teacher activities. Roger organised Japanese Evenings, Language Competitions, Speech Contests and Teacher Inservice.

Roger has been a Teacher of Japanese and Deputy Principal at Shailer Park State High School.

Roger's tireless efforts and input brought about this association's first constitution as an Incorporated Association.

He was ASLLP Project Coordinator and is presently a Principal Education Officer, in the Languages and Cultures Unit, Education Queensland, a position he held ever since the implementation of the Queensland LOTE Initiative.

Life Member – Anna van Hoof

Anna van Hoof has contributed substantially to Language Teachers' Associations at State and National levels, showing her very strong commitment to language teaching and learning in Australia.

During her career, Anna has taught in all sectors: primary, secondary and tertiary. In 1999 she is Principal Education Officer - Curriculum - responsible for the development of LOTE curriculum for Education Queensland. In this capacity she is also Manager of the Writing team for the LOTE Syllabus and source materials on behalf of QSCC. In 1983-1986 Anna was In-Service Officer (Foreign Languages) at the Board of Senior Secondary School Studies with the responsibility for assisting teachers in the introduction of the Review of School Based Assessment and in-service on the calculation of the Tertiary Entrance Score. - 1959 - 60 o 105 members at the first meeting of the MLTAQ
- o First Subscriptions: City Members - 1 pound, Country Members -15 shillings, Students - 5 shillings. For an additional 5 shillings per year members could receive 3 copies of Babel, the journal of the MLTA of Victoria, South Australia & West Australia.
- o From the address of Professor James Mahoney, the first President of the MLTAQ, to the 25th AGM, we read:
- “One of the reasons for the formation of the MLTAQ was the concern of the Language Departments of the University of Queensland over the decline in the study of Latin and Greek; they feared that French and German would be next. We have made a lot of progress since then, but unfortunately our fears have not been altogether stilled.”
- 1968 o From Wim Goosen’s 1968 President’s Report:
- “Where have all the members gone? While membership has by no means fallen, no major gains were made in 1968. Concern was expressed that some younger Teachers join in their first year, but fail to renew their subscriptions. Ways of improving services to members were discussed, and Professor Leopold suggested that absolute regularity of meeting time each month might help attendances as far as city members were concerned. This suggestion will be put to members at the March meeting. Action by the committee to catch and hold the interest of members was felt to be of prime importance.”
- 1969 - 70 o A note from the Treasurer, Mr H.T.Baker:

“The Cost of memberships were raised to \$4.00, \$3.00 & \$2.00, for Metropolitan, Country & Student Members. Members might be interested how their subscriptions are spent:

Babel \$1.50; Affiliation Fee \$0.50; Postage of Newsletter \$0.30 approx; Postage of notices etc \$0.30 approx.

This leaves for other expenses: Metrop. members - \$1.40, Country members - 40 cents, Student members - nil. Although the Association made a loss during 68 -69, it is only the profits of Film Evenings and, this year, of the Schools’ Night that are maintaining the credit balance as shown in the financial statement.”

1971 - 72 ○ Cost of membership increased from \$4 to \$6.00 and from \$3 to \$5.00.
Student membership remained at \$2.00.

1974 - 75 ○ The Association had around 200 members.

1977 -78 ○ Membership grew to 348.

○ From David Ingram’s 1978 President’s Report, we read: “The membership of the Association continues to grow. Up to 1974 - 75 membership regularly hovered around 200. Since then, despite the continued decline in language enrolments, membership has increased by 2/3rds to 348. Attendance at meetings has also improved ranging from 30 to 50 for meetings of an in service training character & up to 800 for the most recent community education activity of the Greek Standing Committee. School events continue, of course, to attract the largest numbers, with the last Oktoberfest being attended by approximately 3,000 students. “

1981 - 82 ○ Number of members: 330.

1982 -83 ○ Membership dropped to 272.

1983 - 84 ○ Membership stood at 315 as a result of a greater number of Dip. Ed. students.

1988-89 ○ From the Newsletter Editor, Wendy Parkinson: “Fees have increased from last year to meet increased costs. This is where your money goes:

Capitation fees to AFMLTA per member \$16.00

(\$8 of this pays for 3 issues of Babel)

Fees to QEAS \$ 3.00

Publishing and posting of 4 News briefs \$12.00

Publishing and posting of 4 Newsletters \$12.00

Extraordinary mailings eg AGM info etc \$ 1.00

Total \$44.00

The shortfall is made up by the sales of stickers, stamps and posters, and various MLTAQ functions throughout the year, eg Oktoberfest. Membership currently stands at approximately 500, a record enrolment. Despite this, we desperately need more active members, to be on the Executive and to convene Subcommittees.”

1996

- o Membership has reached 536 this year.

- o From the Report by the present Treasurer to the 1997 Annual General Meeting:

“An Overview of MLTAQ Inc Finances has been compiled from the audited figures.

The main income [Membership fees and Advertising] came to \$27,400.50. The MLTAQ Inc Running expenses [Publications, AFMLTA dues, Branch payments, Insurance and general running expenses] came to \$34,531.49, showing a loss of \$7221.99. A solid profit was made in most activities organised by the Sub Committees and the Executive again this year, in particular the sale of stickers & the German Oktoberfest as well as interest from the two Term Deposits of \$3371.20, has meant that the Association was able to cover this loss of \$7221.99.

The cost of Teachers attending Conferences on behalf of the MLTAQ Inc was \$622.53. Inflation with our publications also needs to be costed in. If profits from other activities were not available a very substantial increase in Membership dues would need to be considered.

Future Price of Membership of the MLTAQ Inc - For these reasons an increase of \$10.00 has been recommended to the last Executive Meeting.”

1997

- o 516 members.

- o The Institution Membership Category was discontinued in the hope of increasing the number of active individual MLTAQ Inc members.

1998

- o 500 members.

- o From the Treasurer’s Report:

“Memberships - The income from 1998 Memberships was down by only 16 members from last year, with 23 members joining as part of the conference. The income, with the cost of memberships by \$10 to \$55 and \$60, has increased to \$28,542. All members now pay the \$5 ‘Branch’ fee and this is allocated to the indicated Branch or Metropolitan Brisbane. Hence the increase in “metro” members to 322. \$5 per member was paid for 138 Branch members.

MLTAQ Inc basic Expenses - Income from memberships versus the cost of running the association {publications, AFMLTA Inc etc}. Even with the extra \$10 per member this year there is still a LOSS of \$5,163.00, but this is down from the 1997 loss of \$7,962.00. The interest from Term Deposits (\$32297.14) and most of the profit from the sale of stickers (\$2295.00) is needed to balance the books on the basic expenditure. *Hence it is essential to maintain at least the present level of investment in term deposits.*

Four years ago the amount transferred to members funds (ie the overall profit across all MLTAQ activities) greatly decreased, \$10,000 to \$2,291. At last 1998 saw an upward trend, thanks to the work of some dedicated MLTAQ Inc workers, in particular in areas such as State Conference, sale of stickers & the German Oktoberfest.”

When you look back through past MLTAQ records, publications etc, the statements re the continued need for our association are all very similar.

The study of languages is still an “elective “ in Years 9 - 12 in the secondary school even though there is now language learning across years 4 or 5 through to Year 8, thanks to the LOTE Initiative (1990 - 1997). LOTE is supposedly one of the 8 *Core* Key Learning Areas, but State school Teachers are still awaiting the decisions from Education Queensland based on the new Queensland Schools Curriculum Council Syllabus.

In **Secondary Schools**, the question of CORE LOTE learning from Years 8 to 10 adding to the ever increasing minimum student numbers at which school administrations allow LOTE classes to run, are concerns for LOTE Teachers.

In **Primary Schools**, LOTE specialist teaching is an important part of primary school life, even if only, in a few schools, because of the *non-* Contact time issues.

In some schools, both primary and secondary, language Teachers have to work harder than others to convince their school communities of the real benefits to their students of language learning.

At the **Tertiary level**, whilst the numbers of students studying some languages has increased, there is still pressure on Language Departments to keep up or increase their student numbers and so the financial income to their departments.

**The need for the Modern Language Teachers Association in Queensland
is still as great as it was nearly forty years ago.**

Some of the roles and responsibilities have varied considerably over the years, especially in the area of Publications.

1978 saw the start of the Newsbrief and in 1984 the *Newsletter* and *Journal* became one publication. The *Newsbrief* is presently known as the *LoteNote* and the *Newsletter* is now known as the *MLTAQuarterly*.

Until 1977 the Treasurer was both the Treasurer and the Membership Secretary.
