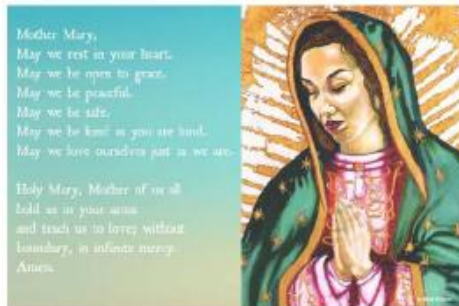


May the month of Mary

ARTIST IN RESIDENCE

On Tuesday 30th April 2024 the Year 5 and Year 6 students took part in a workshop with David Booth as part of the CESA Aboriginal Education Community Engagement Program. David provided opportunities to develop understanding of and respect for Aboriginal histories, cultures and languages through music, stories, and the construction of a mural. We were privileged to hear David play the yidaki (digeridoo) and help us in the creation of a painting for St Patrick's School's 60th Birthday celebrations.

WHAT IS PBIS

Please see below some information regarding our Positive Behaviour Intervention Support program.

Last term, the school PBIS Leadership team which is made up of teaching and ESO staff representatives, Mrs Ahern, Mrs O'Callaghan and Mr Mannella, attended the first of four professional learning days for this program.

Next week we will be attending the second day which focusses on the importance of the collection of data to plan for positive behaviour support for our students.

Since our first day back in February, there has been much work put into the implementation of the program strategies and we are already seeing pleasing results. Our work with data will allow us to monitor the behaviour changes that we hope to achieve and subsequently bring about whole school, class and individual changes to behaviour. The results of which will subsequently bring about improved teaching and learning outcomes for our children.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOR INTERVENTION SUPPORT (PBIS)

What is PBIS?

(Positive Behaviour Intervention Support)

- PBIS is an evidence-based multi-tiered framework for supporting students' behavioral, academic, social, emotional and mental health.
- When implemented with fidelity, the PBIS whole school approach creates positive, predictable, equitable and safe learning environments that support everyone for success.
- **A problem-solving framework**
- Systematic implementation of evidence-based practices.
- **A multi-tiered continuum of support**
- Layers in increasingly more intensive environmental supports to increase the likelihood students are academically, emotionally, and socially successful



Outcomes:

First, the school sets measurable and achievable outcomes related to social competence and academic achievement that are embraced by all staff and families.

Practices:

- Once the desired outcomes are established, the school identifies practices (what we do for students) that are supported with educationally relevant evidence.
- These practices should be based on the school's needs, be relevant, effective, and efficient. They are based upon the principles of applied behaviour analysis, are research based, and embrace a positive, proactive, and instructional approach.



ENRICHMENT AT ST PAT'S

In addition to program extension in class, we are fortunate enough to be able to provide an Enrichment Program where opportunities are given to extend learning in different areas.

During Term 1, some students were involved in activities that involve Ethical Thinking and debating skills.

I was also able to take 6 students to a 1-day science workshop run by GATEways Eureka and held at Dominican School in Semaphore. On this day, the students were highly engaged in critical and creative thinking as well as problem solving within the areas of Biological Science (focus on haematology and different blood types) and fossils (focus on palaeontology with problem solving using radioactive dating techniques).

Wednesday

Playgroup, family fun for families with children under 5 years from 9.30 – 11.30 am throughout the terms.

Note: Playgroup SA has partnered with the Office for the Early Years (Department of Education) to provide free development checks for children aged 12 months to 4 years. The checks provide an opportunity to monitor your child's development, identify any concerns and celebrate milestones. A development check helps to monitor whether a child is meeting the milestones for their age (such as dressing or talking). Please note this is not a health check.

PREMIER'S BE ACTIVE CHALLENGE INFORMATION

Premier's *be active* Challenge Guidelines

What is the Premier's *be active* Challenge?

- The Premier's *be active* Challenge is a physical activity program introduced by the Premier in 2007 to encourage students to be more active more often and to improve student health and wellbeing.

Who can participate:

- **All students.** The Premier's *be active* Challenge is open to all South Australian students from Reception to year 12, as well as home schools and families.

What must students do:

- The Challenge requires students to do at least 60 minutes of physical activity on at least 5 days of the week for at least 4 weeks from the start of the school year until the end of week 10, term 3.
- Students must record their physical activity on the relevant **student recording booklets** or **class progress charts**.
- A teacher or parent/carer must endorse the student physical activity record to indicate that the student has met the participation requirements.

Appropriate physical activity: Physical activity level

To meet their daily requirement, students should undertake 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity (MVPA). Examples include riding a bike, playing tag games, dancing, playing sport, walking to or from school. Physical activity does not need to be in one block of 60 minutes – it can be shorter amounts of activity that add up to 60 minutes.

The Challenge will finish at the end of Week 8 Term 3. Please return sheets by Thursday the 12th of September to the front office.

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AMBULANCE COVER

Ambulance cover

The school has ambulance cover for students who have accidents here at school or while on a school organised event. However, this cover does not include students with a pre-existing condition such as asthma and anaphylaxis or reactions to allergies.

We will ring an ambulance if we need support in administering first aid, however in the case of students with pre-existing conditions the parents will be charged by Ambulance SA for their service.

This can cost upward of \$900 so we strongly encourage you to take out ambulance cover, particularly

if your child has a pre-existing health condition.

FROM THE FINANCE OFFICER

School Fees 2024

A friendly reminder to those families, who do not have a direct debit set up, that Term 1 fees were due the last day of Term 1 the 12/4/24. If your fees are still outstanding please pay as soon as possible, thank you.

We offer direct debit, BPay, EFTPOS and direct deductions from Centrelink payments to cater to the changing financial needs of our families at St Patrick's School. When the direct debit payment option is selected your school fee payment is calculated over the full school year right up until the 31st of December 2024. This means smaller payments are required, making this method the most affordable way to budget for your commitment. Please come into the office or ring me on 83034500 if one of these options would better suit your financial requirements.

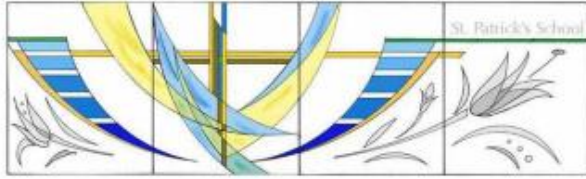
