### **PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE**

### **New Learning Spaces**

With the continued growth of our college, we have developed new learning spaces to accommodate individual needs and interests of our young people. These improvements have added value to the spaces and many students have remarked on how well these additions are supporting their learning.

### Attendance

As we enter into Term 3, a reminder that 'everyday counts,' for our young people. Semester 1 averaged around 80% attendance, which is a great result, however we are always wanting to improve our overall school attendance and strive for 85%. A reminder to all families, that when your child/ward is unwell with an ongoing medical condition (2 days or more), we do require a medical certificate to ensure that the absence is explained. In addition, it is important that for any day that your child/ward is absent from school, parents/caregivers are required to inform the college with an acceptable explanation of their absence before 9am.

### **Senior School Arts Exhibition**

Senior students' artwork will be on display at Robina Community Centre the first two weeks of Term 3 2022 (13th – 25th July, 2022). This is a fantastic opportunity for us to showcase and celebrate the creativity and talent of our senior art students. We welcome our parents, guardians and Arcadia community to view the wonderful creations.

### **Distance Education**

Arcadia College is now accredited to deliver our programs via an online learning platform (Distance Education). We are now accepting enrolments for Years 9 and 10 students only to commence Term 3, 2022 Distance Education (DE). ### Year 7

Year 7 have been exploring the universe and investigated how scientific elements have affected the relationship between the Earth, Moon and Sun this term. We have studied moon cycles, seasons, tides. The interest in this subject was astounding and students met with up regularly with their science teacher to discuss our world. Students designed delicious healthy wraps during innovation and enjoyed eating their amazing creations. Mathematics was delivered in fun and engaging ways, and students developed a deeper understanding of budgets through mock shopping experiences and financial mathematics. Students collaboratively retold their version of the Narran Lake Dreamtime story and created number books in Yugambeh for students affected by the recent floods in the Northern Rivers.



### Year 8

The year 8 classroom became a Shark Tank where students built on their entrepreneurial capabilities and developed their own businesses linked to real world contexts. They brought this to life, through a Market Stall, selling their products to staff and students. Through engaging Art lessons students were given opportunities to showcase their own tags on large graffiti boards using skills learnt. They also wrote a short story, from the perspective of a worker in a developing country and this was linked into maths lessons as students discovered the difference between a living wage and a working wage.

# **SOCIAL MEDIA CONCERNS**

### Cyberbullying

Cyberbullying is when someone uses the internet to be mean to a child or young person so they feel bad or upset. It can happen on a social media site, game, app, or any other online or electronic service or platform. It can include: posts, comments, texts, messages, chats, livestreams, memes, images. videos and emails.

Sadly, cyberbullying happens a lot in Australia and around the world. 44% of Australian young people report having a negative online experience in the last 6 months, this includes 15% who received threats or abuse online.

eSafety helps prevent and deal with cyberbullying and its impacts. They do this by providing information, education and resources, and by investigating and helping to fix the most serious cases of cyberbullying.

### As a parent/caregiver what should you do?

If someone is being mean online, first of all it's a good idea to:

- Report the content to an Arcadia staff member or trusted adult.
- Change the setting on your device online or block any content you do not wish to see.
- · Report it to the social media site or via eSafety
- Report anonymously via Stymie
