### WELCOME BACK TO TERM 3!

### SCHOOL UNIFORM

With the chillier weather it is time to check your children have the correct school jumpers / jackets and long pants. The Uniform Shop is now selling the new (very popular) black hoodies in our Junior School sizes. Remember jeans, clothes with prominent stripes or logos and hoodies (excluding our Yr6 Commemorative jumpers) are not acceptable. Besides the official uniform items, any other clothing must be plain black or navy (no logo.) Don't forget to name all items so clothing can quickly be returned to its owner. Throughout the cooler months we will be encouraging all children to maintain the excellent standard we achieved in Terms 1 and 2.

### Please note that appropriate dress code DOES NOT include:

- Baseball caps
- Jeans
- Mini skirts and brief shorts- nothing shorter than mid-thigh
- Make up, nail polish, tattoos, skin or clothing graffiti, body piercing, **false nails**
- Jewellery – standard sleepers or studs for ears only -for safety

The purpose of this is to develop a sense of school pride and unity amongst the members of the school community.

If you require support in accessing acceptable clothing for your child, please speak with a member of the leadership team.

### BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL SUPERVISION

Teachers begin yard duty in the morning at 8:30am. Please make sure your child is not coming to school before this time. OSHC is available from 6:30 until 8:30am in the mornings. With Winter upon us the mornings are chilly and often wet. It is still **very concerning** that a number of students are arriving well before 8.30am (as early as 8.00am!!) by entering through the back gate or Senior School. **There are no staff on duty at this time.** Please check that your child does not enter the grounds before 8.30am.

Our learning starts at 8.45am. It is extremely important for all children to be organized and ready to learn together in their classrooms at 8.45am. **Our Front Gate will be closing directly after the 8.45am learning bell is sounded.** If your child is late, they will need to enter via College Central and then collect a late pass from our Junior School Front Office. Teachers are on duty in the afternoon until 3:30pm.

## NEW REGULATIONS

To make our schools a healthy and safe place for everyone, new regulations have been introduced which expand the smoke-free and vape-free areas around schools and preschools. This message provides you with an update on the new rules and outlines expectations for parents, teachers and visitors to schools. The laws aim to reduce the danger to children and young people from passive tobacco smoking and passive e-cigarette vaping.

From 1 March 2024, you must not smoke or vape anywhere on school grounds and within 10 metres of the school boundary. This includes:

- at school drop-off and pick-up zones that are within 10 metres of the school fence, gate or boundary
- on school ovals and sporting fields and within 10 metres of the boundary of the oval or sporting field
- footpaths, roads, public nature strips and public recreation areas that are within 10 metres of a school boundary.

These rules apply all the time, even outside of school hours. If caught in smoking or vaping in these areas, you may receive a fine from police or an authorised government officer.

Thank you for helping us maintain a safe and healthy environment for children and young people.

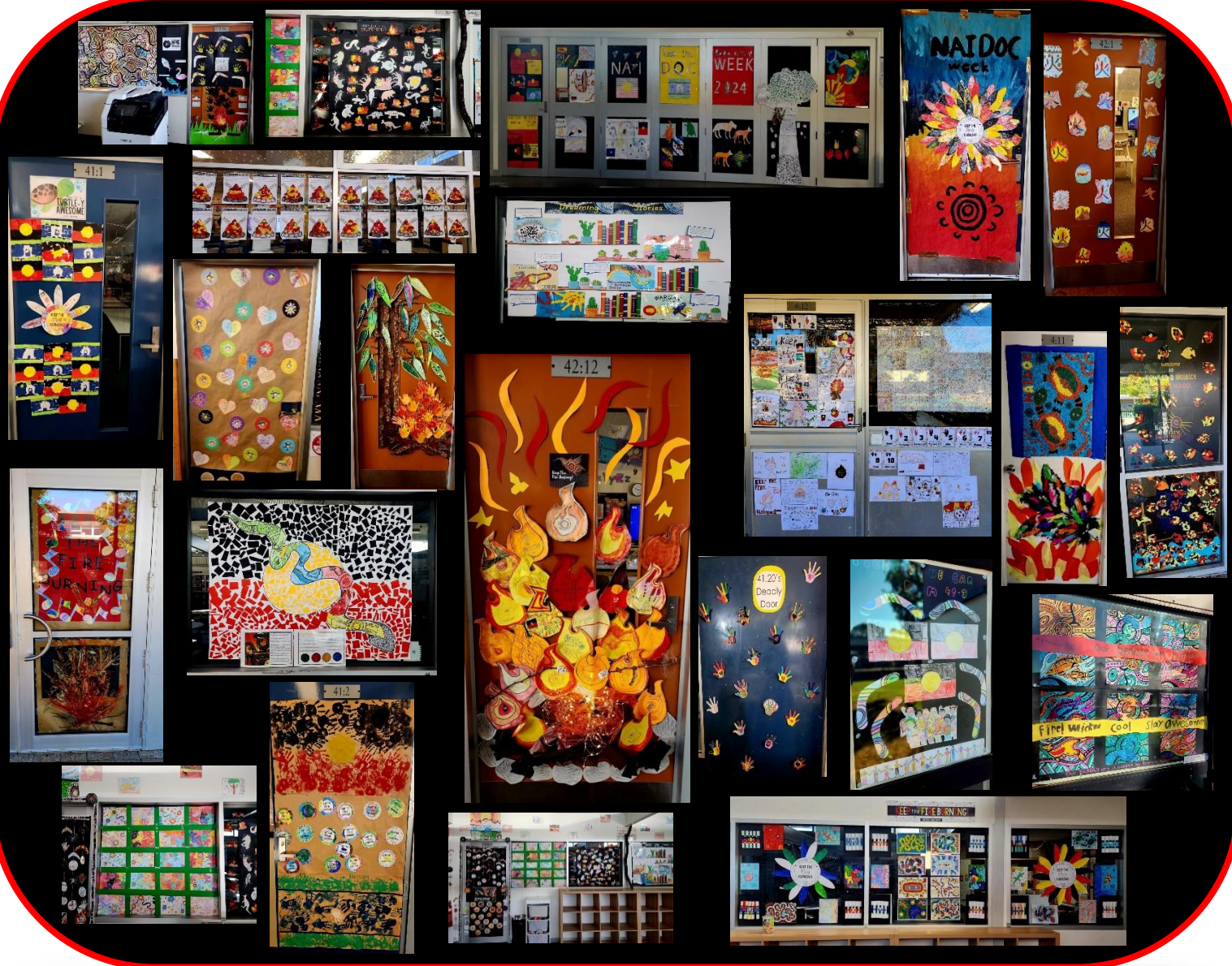

## Learning in Mr. Singh's class

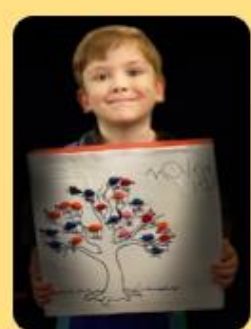
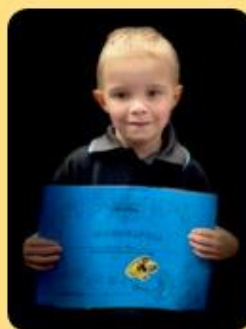
On National Simultaneous Storytime Day our class read the book Bowerbird Blues by Aura Parker. The children found it very interesting so we read it a few times every day, for next week or so.

After reading the book so many times, we had a collaborative discussion about creating something based on the book, in our art lesson. The main focus for us was to create a piece of art from waste.

For next few days, during our voyages around the school, our bowerbirds put up a team effort and collected a lot of random blue objects from the yard, hidden in the bark in the playground, under the bridge next to the library and from the flower beds and bushes. Our collection included cans, bottles, pegs, buttons, paint brushes and straws. We then gave the objects a good wash and through a consultation, selected the objects that we thought would suit best to our needs. Next step for us was to decide and select the material for the bowerbird and we decided to use some of our overflowing stock of pistachio shells.

We then printed our background, a bowerbird nest and glued it on a pizza box. After that we painted some pistachio shells in blue colour and glued them on the bowerbird. The pre-selected blue objects were then meticulously placed at allocated and marked spots on the box.
