Monday 25th – Thursday 28^{th Mar} PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS **READING** is a lifelong skill. In the Junior School, staff are always looking at current research and resourcing to ensure we support our learners for all aspects of reading. As part of our 2024 School Improvement Plan, our 'Goal' is to' To increase the number of students achieving in the **EXCEEDING** proficiency standard **in the Junior School**. Our teachers focus on this through a 'Challenge of Practice': If we continue to build the capacity of teachers to implement targeted differentiated teaching of reading based on the Big 6 then we will increase student achievement in reading in the Junior School R-6. Our 'Actions' include: Teachers explicitly teach phonemic awareness skills daily and use data to inform next steps in teaching. Daily Review and Instructional Routines of systematic synthetic phonics and morphology, explicitly teach reading comprehension and expert teaching implementing the Australian Curriculum through Explicit Direct Instruction pedagogical practices. We will continue to share and celebrate our Reading focus with our families.

PARENT/TEACHER INTERVIEWS will be held in Week 9. At parent/teacher interviews, please take time to ask about your child/ren's reading progress so you can work in partnership with us between home and school.

NAPLAN

This year NAPLAN testing will occur in Weeks 7 & 8, starting on Wednesday 13 March. You can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is a part of their school program and reminding them to simply do their best. Some explanation of NAPLAN is useful to help students understand and be comfortable with the format of the tests; however, it is not necessary for parents/carers to do this. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance. These are assessments that provide governments, schools and families with a snapshot of children's abilities in these areas. It is important to remember that it is that, a snapshot. We, as a school also collect other, more frequent, assessment data that helps teachers to track and monitor learning. We can discuss this learning data with families during parent-teacher interviews.

Science News with Ms Burton and Ms Selway -TERM 1

Welcome back, Junior School Scientists! It's a brand new year filled with exciting discoveries and hands-on experiments. Ms Burton and Ms Selway are thrilled to kick off the first newsletter of the year, highlighting the captivating world of science that awaits us.

Years 5/6 and Primary Jacaranda - Physical Science - It's Electrifying: For students in Years 5 and 6, as well as Primary Jacaranda, the buzz is all about electricity. From constructing simple circuits to exploring conductors and insulators, our young scientists are sparking their curiosity as they unravel the secrets of this electrifying topic Junior Jacaranda - Physical Science - Push and Pull: In Junior Jacaranda, the focus is on the basics of physical science, with students learning about the fundamental concepts of push and pull. Through interactive demonstrations and playful activities, they are discovering how these forces shape movement and interactions in the world around them.

WHAT IS SCHOOL CARD?

School Card provides financial help to cover the cost of school fees.

WHO CAN APPLY?

To qualify for School Card, your family's income must be below a specific limit. This limit depends on how many children are in your care.

You must also meet at least one of the following:

- have a child or children aged four years or over who attend a school full time
- be an independent full-time student studying year 10, 11 or 12
- be an adult re-entry student undertaking subjects to complete SACE (years 11 and 12).

After you apply, you will receive a letter in the mail advising if your application has been approved. Please note, School Card is not a student identification card.
