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We the People 264 The Degrading Burka meets the PC Mob.



Good Day to you. A question today listeners.....what is it that makes the Greens and Labor and to some extent the Coalition deny a person the right to speak and the right to protest. Well, Pauline Hanson demonstrated that, when she wore a burka into the Senate. It is the story of her physical and emotional journey to freedom. Her transition from a primitive dark tribal mind-set that restricts women's every thought and action to a life as a free and equal citizen in an open society. She says the burka and **"the veil deliberately marks women as private and restricted property, nonpersons. The veil sets women apart from men and apart from the world, it restrains them, confines them, grooms them for docility. A mind can be cramped just as a body may be and a Muslim veil blinkers both your vision and your destiny. It is the mark of a kind of apartheid, not the domination of a race but of a gender."** Her book is highly critical of Islam and the multiculturalism which the author sees as enabling its extremism, and makes the controversial case that Christian churches should actively seek to convert Muslim believers.

There are many stories like this but it takes a very courageous person to stand up and be counted as it appears Islam doles out the death penalty for apostasy as is instructed in the Koran at (4.89). Ayaan Hirsi Ali walked away from Islam. Now, what Pauline Hanson has done in wearing the burka into the Senate is to highlight the Islamic oppression and subjugation of women. The tradition is imposed by Muslim males and is an affront to women in all cultures. It shows clearly the cultural and religious chasm between the free world and that of Islam and I don't believe the Islamic culture and ours can coexist. We owe Pauline Hanson a debt of gratitude even in the midst of the torrent of abuse by the Greens and Labor and the weeping George Brandis. All Pauline Hanson has done is to visually express a view and stand up for Australian women and national security and I think that's most courageous.
