



The majority of winter grazing cereals would have been planted by now and with rain late in March these crops will be off to a great start. Hopefully we can get some good growing weather before ground temperatures start to drop off.

From cereals we move onto new pastures, with April normally an ideal time to be sowing. If you have been waiting for the rain before making a decision to order seed, then I would encourage you to do so now as some varieties have sold out or are in short supply.

#### **TOPDRESSING**

Bulk super prices have remained stable and with the recent rain the pastures will start growing. To maximise pasture growth rates before winter, topdressing with single super is recommended. For all enquiries contact Angus in store.

# Cattle Programme

April is one of the critical months to be treating for Liverfluke. This is because by waiting for the soil temperature to drop the host snails that carry the fluke go into a hibernation cycle over winter, which reduces the risk of re-infection after treating.

This year, because of the dry seasonal conditions, livestock have been grazing in areas where liverfluke snail exist, so it's even more important to treat animals.

The recommended April treatment is to

use a product that controls all 3 stages of liverfluke, as you want to control early immature and immature fluke that could still be migrating to wards the liver and damaging the intestinal wall, plus the adult fluke already in the liver. Products such as Flukare C or Genesis Ultra would be an option — Nitrofluke & Nitromec are also good rotational products to use.

Cattle Guard is a new generic product developed by Zoetis that is a Moxidectin pour-on product with the same active ingredient as Cydectin Pour-On. ## Sheep Programme

When joining season is complete the scanning of ewes to detect pregnancy can occur from 40 days onwards. This will be helpful this year if feed is in tight supply.
