Healthy Club Trial a Boost for Golden Square

By any measure, Bendigo FL club Golden Square can claim to be one of country Victoria's best.

The Bulldogs have not only won the last five consecutive BFL premierships but have also become an off-field leader through AFL Victoria's 'Healthy Footy Club Trial'.

A recent report released by La Trobe University has shown the impact of small changes designed to improve the health of club members and supporters.

The three-year program has involved several components, including offering healthier options at the club's canteen and mid-strength beer at the Bulldogs match-day bar during the game.

Survey results suggest the move to mid-strength beer is paying off.

Of the more than 500 people surveyed, 71% thought that the move to mid-strength was good idea.

In another sign of its popularity with supporters, 68% of people surveyed at four Golden Square home games thought that it would be good if the mid-strength policy was extended to every ground in the Bendigo FL.

Spectators who normally drink full-strength beer were also asked to nominate their first choice alternative if a full bar was not available. In 2012, 45% nominated full-strength mixed drinks and 39% nominated mid-strength beer

But in 2013 those nominating mid-strength beer rose to

Golden Square President Jy Pertzel said responsible alcohol management was now clearly aligned to the club's values and goals.

filt really started about 10 years ago with small changes being made to improve our off-field culture," Pertzel said.

"When AFL Victoria approached us with this project three years ago we were ripe to be involved and take things a step further."

"Overall all we think it's been a positive outcome that's benefited the whole club."

"We've had the odd complaint from people wanting to buy a full strength beer but overall we haven't seen our revenue in this area drop off or seen anyone leave because of it." "Focusing on our culture through this initiative has also helped us build better relationship with our junior club and had an impact on ability to recruit players."

"When we speak to players about coming to our club, the fact we have a good culture is usually a big selling point."

AFL Victoria Cultural Strategy Manager John Strachan said Golden Square had showed great leadership by being the first and only club involved in this program.

"Golden Square's focus is on being a healthy club that is inclusive and family friendly," Strachan said.

"Alcohol has not disappeared from the club, but its culture has shifted."

"Underage drinking has been targeted with a "no tolerance" approach and "All you can drink" events have changed to "six drink tickets" events.

Strachan said the Healthy Footy Club Trial has proved that making small changes can have a big impact.

The Health Footy Club Trial has been conducted in partnership with VicHealth.



Football Preview

TIME TO STAND UP

LANGWARRIN is out of form – but very much under the spotlight.

So says its coach Gavin Artico, who admits the Kangaroos' steady slide down the ladder this season has frustrated the hell out of him.

And after four successive losses, Artico is happy for his side to be put under the microscope.

He hopes it will jolt his players into action.

"We've been hit by a number of injuries, which is no excuse," Artico said.

"We've been in winnable positions in games against the top bracket. But...whether it's a belief issue, or a concentration thing; whether it's a passion thing... There's a number of question marks hanging over the way guys are finishing games off.

"It's just frustrating.

"We've shown we are good enough. But then a simple instruction, (they) don't follow it, concentration goes and good sides put you away."

Langwarrin was on top of the ladder after round four, but six weeks later has been shunted to sixth spot.

But with a favourable draw, the Kangaroos can come again.

They face a rejuvenated PINES today, followed by Karingal and Chelsea. Langwarrin defeated all three earlier in the season.

Artico is demanding a spirited display against Pines today.

"We're keeping it as simple as we can and preparing as best we can but at some stage the group has got to stand up and show they want to fight it out," he said.

"At the moment they are proving a lot of the people around the footy world in Peninsula right who say they've got talent but they can't cut it. It sounds harsh but it is reality."

Pines has won two on the trot and is looking to make its own mark this season.

On a seven-game tear, BONBEACH has proven it can handle all sides in the competition – except one.

EDI-ASP are the Sharks' bogey side. The Eagles collared Bonny in last season's grand final and gave them a 41-point beating on Good Friday.

Today, the next instalment of this great rivalry takes place at Edi's home turf at Regent Park.

Bonbeach coach Steve Capp said his side is coming off its best win of the season last week when it kicked 20 goals to beat Mornington.

Capp says his Sharks – injury-free and confident - are ready to peg one back on Edi-Asp.

"We know what to expect from them," Capp said.

"They are going to come out all guns blazing and they are travelling pretty nicely as well.

"So, we expect it to be a really big game. And that's what we are looking forward to at the moment. We just love being challenged every week."

Bonbeach captain Shane McDonald is having a dominant season and will have a big say in today's outcome. Edi-Asp spearhead Jarrod Garth bagged five goals last week and will be one to watch today.

REDLEGS READY FOR CHALLENGE

Win these and Damien Kent's crew will be well on their way to September success. YCW are building nicely. 



Accreditation!!

We have been harping on about accreditation all year. All umpires, field, boundary and goal are required to complete their umpire accreditation, whether you are in your first year or fifty-fifth. Level 1 Accreditation requires you to complete 3 steps: an online assessment, diary entries and then coach's observations. You MUST complete all 3 parts and hand them to Mark Mounsey or the SUA office. Once you have done this, they will be sent off and you will receive your official certificate. You have not completed accreditation until all three have been completed. We urge ALL umpires, if you have not begun this process, or not sure what this is, head to the SUA website for more information, and begin this as soon as possible.

We are responsible locally for the governance and application of AFL Victoria Country's rules and regulations and our Football Development Managers are responsible for the development and growth of the sport at all levels. We are also a membership based body and will continue to deliver benefits for that membership.

As the overseeing body for football in the region, it is imperative that planning for the future takes a high priority at this early stage of the Commission's existence. AFL South East is here to stay and through appropriate, diligent and feasible planning, we can all look forward to a cohesive, dynamic and progressive football environment into the future.


