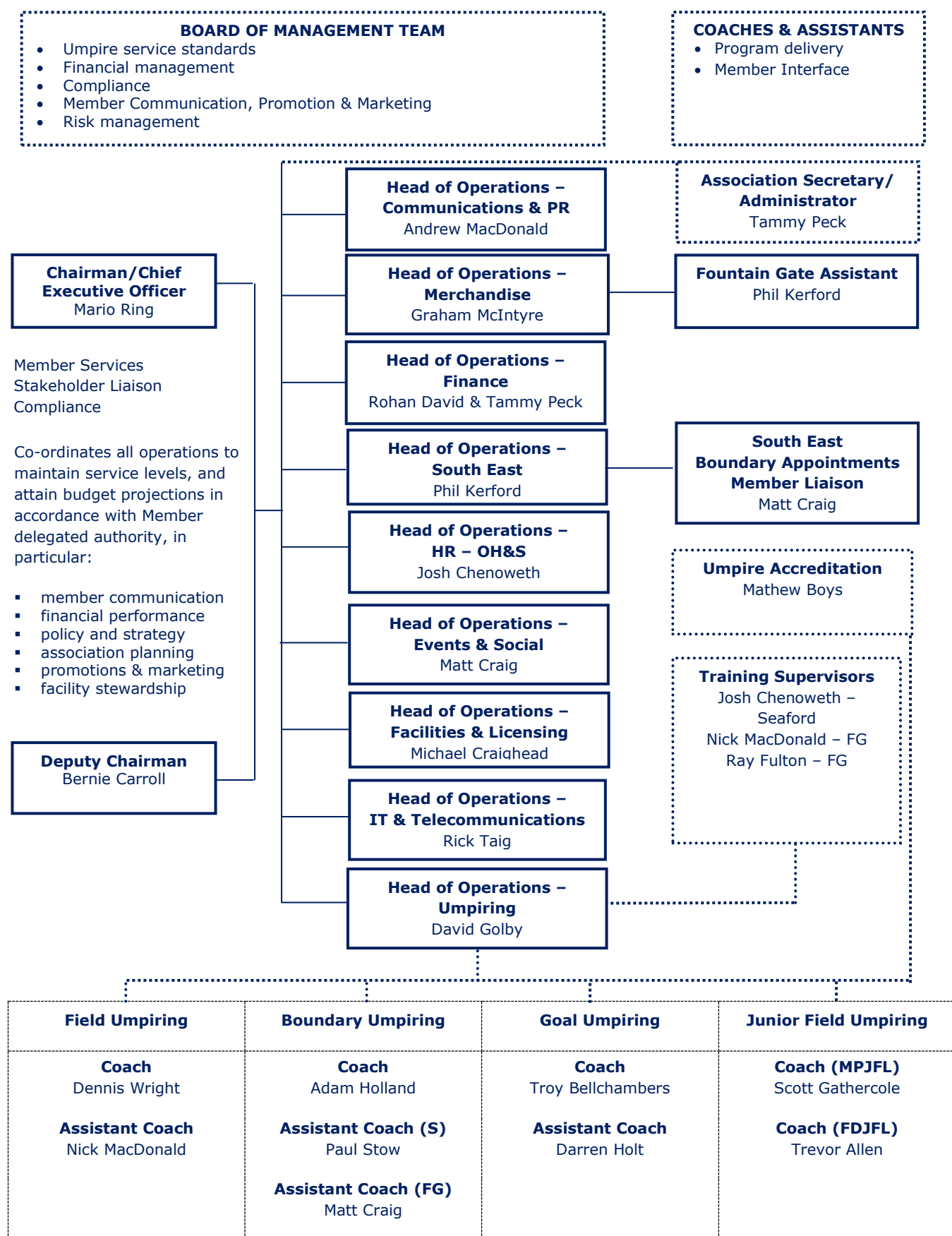

Season 2017 has been another outstanding year for the SUA. The year started off placing three new coaches, and an Umpire Director. Dennis Wright excepting the head coach role, Nick McDonald taking up the assistant coaches roll, Adam Holland head Boundary coach, and David Golby the Umpires directors roll. Early February was the start of a very busy, and busy season. The SUA took on the FDJFLU, as well as all the girls competitions being Div 1, Div 2 and Development.

After the final round, there were changes made this year for the start of next season within the three leagues, there will now be a two-tiered competition being Peninsula and Nepean with a relegation system. SEFNL will be included next year, as it will become a three-tier system with relegations. How this will all pan out, we are not sure, but we will continue to umpire the three leagues as it stands.

The umpiring department has done another outstanding job this year, led by David, Dennis, Troy, Adam, Scott and Trevor. With all the changes going on within the leagues, these guys kept everyone on their toes. They made sure that we did the job we were meant to do, and that was officiate our games the best we can. At times we were stretched to the limit, but all games were filled by some umpires doubling up on games over the weekends and week days.

It was with great pleasure the association was again asked to go the King Island, and help umpire their 2017 preliminary, Junior and senior Grand finals. Rick Morgan doing the Preliminary Final, Tylan Mehmed officiating their Junior GF, and Bernie Carroll officiating in a three system Senior GF. The SUA were also approached to umpire the re-enactment game between Mornington FC and Mordialloc FC, to commemorate the 125 years of the drowning of seven Mornington FC members on the way home after their game at Mordialloc on a rough bay.

As Chairman it has been a very busy year for myself and Deputy Bernie Carroll, with many changes and challenges. We cannot become complacent, as there will be many more changes and challenges in 2018. We are continually meeting with the S.E Commission, as they would like us under their RAC. Bernie and I will be making sure the SUA has a strong voice. There will be many benefits with us joining the commission, umpiring and streamline of many processes, non-negotiables will be our values, Integrity. Fairness and most important our heritage. This will make sure we stay leaders in our field, and continue to grow and become a major hub for umpiring bodies. At this stage the MPJFL still want to continue with their own umpiring group, but feel this will change as it is not in the direction the Commission what to continue. We will keep members informed as things begin to happen, through our communications email.

On a final note, I would like to thank my board members for all their time and commitment throughout the year. I would also like to thank all the running umpires, coaches, parents and partners for their commitment and support through the year. This year has been successful year for the SUA and its members. In relation to reporting and management of injuries, out of our 400 plus members we suffered in total 5 (down from 6 in 2017) injuries, this is great news especially with the integration of the Frankston juniors into SUA. Our total expenses incurred dropped by just over \$1000 YOY however we did have to 2 Claimable LTI injuries.

Since the early intervention program was introduced 4 years ago we have seen a dramatic decrease in lost time injuries (LTI'S) and overall expense incurred by the association. So the next part I'm very excited to deliver again..... with this decrease YOY we have achieved a massive cost saving equalling \$8,000 to the association. Which is a drop in physio bills and a decrease in our insurance premium, which is \$1,000 decrease YOY. A great effort and return off the back of some hard work, proactive injury management along with structured training programs, focusing on strength and conditioning.

In 2014 we welcomed Lifecare as our injury management partner; we have seen outstanding results in 2017 with more umpires being on the park week in and week out, which made it difficult for the coaches especially during the finals. Lifecares early intervention project has help us this year not just by keeping umpires available, but has also prevented minor injuries becoming major ones. I would again like to thanks Matt and the team at Lifecare for their help and assistance in keeping us all fit on the park.

This season we welcomed Indah Health on as a partner with SUA, who offer SUA members Chiro services along with Pilates and Yoga. Emily and the team ran some Pilates sessions for members this season which were well attended along with being enjoyable... Even though a few people found some muscles they never knew they had!!!! Again all of our members have followed the correct procedures in relation to reporting and managing their injuries, which has helped keep our premium to a minimum which is fantastic news. Workcover premiums in any organisation are the second biggest expenses after salaries/wages.

In 2018 I would ask again that everyone again reviews the Operations Manual and refresh themselves with the SUA policy and procedures in relation to injury reporting and management along with our Human Resources policies including code of conduct and workplace standards including Social media policy.

On behalf of the board I would like to thank everyone for their commitment and for making the SUA the premier umpiring body that it is today!

In terms of IT & Telecommunications portfolio in 2017, I have continued my focus of building our social media reach, creating a technology inventory, updating the website and creating how to guides.

Our social media interactions have continued to grow rapidly with a 15% growth across all platforms in 2017. Our Facebook page now sits at over 557 likes. Head of Operations – Umpiring

Season 2017 started the year with the SUA appointing three new head coaches for Field, Boundary and Goal, and also a new Junior Co-ordinator to cater for the inclusion of the Frankston District Junior Umpires. All three Senior Coaches have been running members with the SUA for a number of years and were also Assistant Coaches in 2016 prior to their appointments this year.

One of our aims this year was to retain our Coaching Panel into 2018 and help build on their experiences so that we develop our up and coming umpires whilst also maintaining our senior list. Our Head Coaches need to be supported in order to manage the number of umpires we have officiating at the SUA. In summary there were over 400 running members which included over 60 Goal, 140 Boundary, 120 Senior Field and approximately 80 Junior Field Umpires.

Our age demographic across the group is:

31% - 14 to 16 years old.

37% - 17 to 29 years old (Half of this group were 17 to 19 years and half 20 to 29 years)

12% - 30 to 49 years old.

20% - 50 plus years old.

Looking at the numbers, we need to be able to communicate with young people, as nearly a third of our members are under 16. We have roughly another third in the 'prime' 17 to 29 year age. (Where most of the Clubs Senior playing list is.) The 30 to 49 year age bracket is where we have the least umpires. (Whether retiring players have little interest in umpiring, get into Club roles or simply want a break after playing is unknown.) There has been plenty of advice to suggest some experience in playing makes for a better umpire, yet the stats show we have few umpires in the 'retired players' age bracket. Our final group is the 50 plus bracket with many being under 60 and competent enough to be umpiring Senior footy and mentoring our young group.

Another area we could improve with numbers, is our Women's contingent. With over 400 umpires, less than 20 are women. That's only 5% of our group and plenty of scope to attract more girls into umpiring given the amount of Junior, Intermediate and Senior Women's games being played across all competitions.

Prior to the start of this season the SUA officiated in the Women's TAC Cup Carnival held at Frankston Park. We also nominated 2 Field and 2 Boundary umpires for the Defence Forces preseason Cup. In addition to a host of local practice matches including the 'Bushman's Cup' (Langwarrin v Pearcedale), the SUA umpired the Mordialloc v Mornington game, held to remember a similar event from the 1800s where 15 of the Mornington players lost their lives when their ferry sank in rough seas near home.

Our pre-season also saw the inclusion of many Senior and developing umpires train with V-Line Umpiring Academy. During the year VLine umpires have the opportunity to officiate in Senior Country Championships (1 v 2 being held at the MCG), the best of Metro v VIC Country, several TAC Cup games and the VLine U15 Carnival. Many of our umpires have progressed through the Academy and used it as a pathway to trial for VFL.

In season 2017 all VFL umpires took a week off and trained with their local umpiring body. The SUA were pleased to see 20 current VFL umpires across Field, Boundary and Goal train at Seaford and Fountain Gate where their umpiring careers started. (Note: 1 Field and 1 Goal, ex SUA Umpires, also made the AFL's Umpiring list and debuted in Senior Football this year.)

Each week our Coaches make around 500 umpiring appointments across the Senior, Junior and Women's competitions. A full complement of Field, Boundary and Goal umpires are appointed to all Senior Men's games, whilst Field umpires only are appointed to Women's and Junior competitions.

This year also marked the inclusion of more Women's games with the South East Women's Development competition and SE Women's Division 1 and Division 2 leagues coming under the SUA umbrella. In addition to these games we also supplied umpires to the Bass Coast women's games from the start of year when other umpiring groups couldn't meet that demand.

The inclusion of the Frankston District Juniors also saw our numbers and demand on Coaching resources grow. After an uncertain start our FDJ Co-ordinator regularly made over 90 appointments each week across 60 junior games. (We are currently reviewing the Coaching structure required to support and develop our Junior umpires. More Staff and potentially an additional training night to help smooth numbers from Wednesdays is being considered.)

Training on Wednesday night at Seaford continued to be well run with regular attendances of 80 plus umpires and some nights approaching 100 members. The Fountain Gate training base was also steady with many umpires now residing in the South East Corridor. MPJFL Juniors also had a separate venue supplied by the Rye Football Club.

Structured 'skills based' training has been identified as one item we can do better next year in order to develop Senior and Junior Field umpires. More resources and training plans will be prepared off season for the start of the new year. Along with a review of our Coaching structure, a focus on support staff and observers will be required to improve umpiring. Fitness based training will continue to be run at both Senior Venues but the responsibility will be on the individual to prepare themselves for match day.

Looking ahead the SUA has nominated 2 Field, 1 Boundary and 1 Goal umpire to trial at VFL next year. Demonstrating we are still developing umpires with the skills to take their game to a higher level. The average age of this year's Senior Field Grand Final Umpires was just over 28 years, so again shows we have youth on our side when it comes to officiating the big games at seasons end.

With a good mix of youth and experience, and Coaches that are keen to continue on, we are well placed to go into 2018 and develop our umpires to meet the growing competitions through the South East, Peninsula and Nepean. Women's and Junior competitions will also continue to expand and we will meet these challenges as well.

I look forward to meeting next year's umpires and a revised competition within Peninsula and Nepean and know our Association will prosper with it.

Our goal from the start, was to get quality back into our umpiring and I think we achieved that towards the end of the year. With 130 boundary umpires on our list, it was hard to get the message across but credit to our group, they got on board with our standards.

Training was a major focus and our first year umpires were the ones to set the standards early with heavy attendance from them. We ran drills most nights to improve our skills and learn new things. With the two bases, we wanted to have everyone umpire the same. Over the years, the quality between the two was a big gap, this year we got everyone to umpire the same way. In finals, this showed that we had achieved that goal.

With numbers quite low at the start of the year, this gave us a chance to trial umpires at different levels. This worked to a degree. With the numbers low this meant a lot of double ups. Once we got settled after Easter and numbers built, it was full steam ahead.

With finals approaching, we concentrated on our polish for a strong finals campaign through juniors and seniors. Lots of 3 umpire games to fine tune our game. I think this year was our strongest finals group we have had in 6 years and that's a credit to our whole group.

I would like to thank my Boundary umpires for all their hard work during the year. To all the guys that have helped me throughout the year, thank you.

To David Golby, thanks for all the hours you have put in this year to make it look like everything runs smooth.

Season 2017 has been a busy and challenging year in the Head of Finance role.

The financial result for the year ended 31 October 2017 is a surplus of \$56,360. This has been achieved on a turnover of \$804,454.

This is a solid result. Some of the major factors contributing to this result have been –

- our first season for supplying umpires for the Frankston and District Junior Football League
- meeting an increased commitment to supplying umpires for the South East Womens' Football competitions
- the reduced requirement for the purchase of on-field uniforms from our suppliers
- we were (with very few exceptions) able to provide a full team of umpires (field, boundary and goal) for all of the games each week in the respective competitions
- containment of the level of our WorkCover premium

I would like to thank our Chairman, Mario Ring, for his unwavering commitment to the SUA and for his support to me throughout Season 2017. Very few would realise the time and work that Mario devotes to ensuring the smooth running of the SUA.

I would also like to make special mention of Robyn and Rodney Young for their invaluable assistance behind the bar. I do not know what I would have done without them.

Graham McIntyre has done an outstanding job with our merchandise. I acknowledge Graham's contribution to the SUA over the past decade with our merchandising requirements.

I advise that I will step down from my position on the SUA Board of Management and, therefore, will not be seeking re-appointment to the Head of Finance role for Season 2018.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS **FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2017**

The financial statements cover Southern Umpires Association Inc as an individual entity. Southern Umpires Association Inc is a not for profit Association incorporated in Victoria under the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

The principal activities of the Association for the year ended 31 October 2017 were .

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies **Inventories**

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and are net of any rebates and discounts received.

Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment of losses.

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight line basis over the assets useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss , except for goodwill.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Sale of goods

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and the cessation of all involvement in those goods.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

Revenue from training services is generally recognised once the training has been delivered.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the balance sheet.
