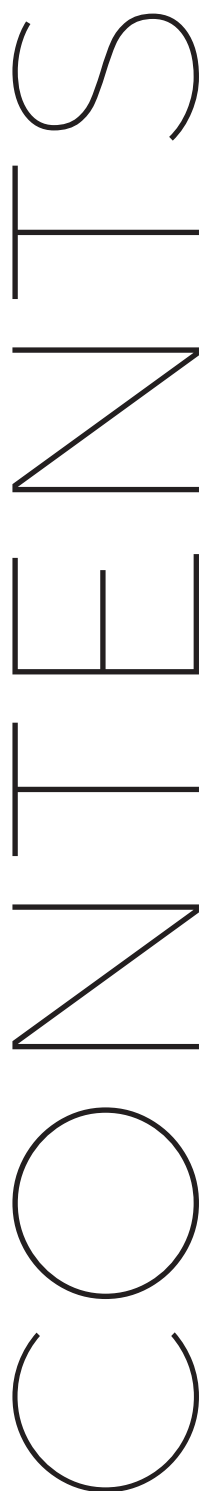

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As I complete my first year as President of Waverley Tennis, it is a good time to reflect on the past year and what has been achieved, through this annual report.

Firstly, it is important to acknowledge our immediate past President, Mark Collins.

I can't say enough about the incredible contribution to community tennis that my predecessor Mark Collins made over a period spanning more than 40 years. It was wonderful to see Mark's contribution recognised through the award of life membership from Tennis Victoria in June 2024.

The next part is the committee of management and our sub-committees. This army of volunteers has the running of our competitions down like clockwork. When you look at the composition of the volunteers and the clubs they represent, you will see we have representatives from around 20 of our member clubs. This is how it should be – the clubs that play overseeing the competitions they play, so they reflect the needs of the clubs.

Leading the way in overseeing how our competitions operate is our Match Committee Chair Trevor Smyth, quite possibly one of the most patient people on the planet. There are a lot of people involved in the running of our weekly competitions, from our team registrar David Kimberley to all our records secretaries (Margaret Quigley, David Kimberley, Tina Feely, Neil Armstrong) who put in a huge amount of effort every week to ensure the integrity of our competitions. In our mid-week men's and ladies' competitions, there are record secretary equivalents making it all happen. And for night competition we have seen a consolidation and strengthening of leagues, ably driven by Nash Cannizzo.

Trevor has the added role of managing all the complaints that come through and does so with due process and tact in what can be a very difficult job. We are looking to make changes to how complaints are managed in the new membership year and are seeking nominations for several club members to be available as part of a pool to assist in resolving complaints, as opposed to having a fixed sub-committee. This is both to share the load and to also provide clubs with an appreciation of the time and effort involved in resolving complaints. Perhaps it may even result in some fresh insights into approaches to nip mischievous complaints in the bud and save everyone's time.

Lyn Gillen leads our junior committee and junior development activities and is similarly on the go year-round, organizing inter-association event teams and several tournaments during the year. There never seems to be a break in her calendar. Lyn is ably assisted by the junior committee (with Toni Peters, Richard Morris, Trevor Smyth and Jude Jusayan) and Brian Hovey for Junior Pennant and Waverley representative team selection, and of course her husband Graeme Gillen, court scheduler extraordinaire. Changes to Hot Shots competition are happening thanks to Toni's efforts, which are greatly appreciated.

Ian Chanter is the glue who has been holding us all together, organising trophies, medals and pennants for all competitions and tournaments. He also manages our

website and has been acting as secretary for most of the year. Unfortunately, Mia Xu, who was elected as secretary at last year's AGM, had to step down from the role during the year for health reasons. We wish her a full recovery and hope to see her back in some capacity in the future.

We then have Donald Smith on our committee, who organised the supervisor vests this year, and of course our Vice President Marcos Ahumada, who also acts as our Association Child Protection Officer. Our meeting times don't work well for coaches, and so we really value the contributions that Marcos can make, as he brings an important perspective to our discussions, as well as having played a key role in the running of our Hot Shots match play competition. Jim Birch, former secretary, continued to support the running of Hot Shots matchplay, despite being retired and living in country Victoria. Jim has also assisted me with the update to the Associations constitution, and with keeping the Association's governance and reporting up to date, given the discontinuity of the secretary position over the past couple of years.

Finally, huge thanks go Victor Yang and Lindsay Coster. We have been working hard behind the scenes to tidy up the financial management and reporting for Waverley Tennis and Doveton Tennis Club. Distinct budgets and financial reporting systems have now been put in place which will make it much clearer and easier in the future to understand the relationship between the two entities. Lindsay has also been instrumental in catching up on outstanding financial matters and chasing down late payments.

All in all, it has been a successful year, with strong team entries in all our competitions. Moving forward, there will be some changes to how we operate. This starts with the Waverley Constitution which is being updated and put before members to vote on at this year's AGM. As mentioned at previous meetings during the year, the constitution was no longer reflective of the rules, regulations and Acts that it needed to comply with, and in many cases was too prescriptive about the structure of committees and sub-committees to manage and run our Association activities.

Once the updated constitution is accepted by members, it must be accepted by Consumer Affairs Victoria, prior to being able to put the changes into operation. At this AGM therefore, we will be maintaining all the roles on the Committee of Management and membership types (full member and Associate member) and putting any changes into effect as of the beginning of the 2025/26 financial year. There are several operational changes in the pipeline:

- Move to on-line team entries for junior weekend competition Summer 2024/25
- Team entry strictly for financial member clubs only (commencing with Summer 2024/25)
- A copy of the club's certificate of Insurance Currency, to be requested at the time of membership renewal.

- Increase in team fees (from \$45 per team inclusive of GST to \$55 per team inclusive of GST). Discount on team entry fees for team entries paid by the due date.
- A plan to make complaints an on-line process and to request clubs to provide nominees to adjudicate on more complex complaints (that aren't referred to Tennis Victoria)

One principle I hold strongly is that our Association competitions should be run by our clubs for our clubs, that we are community tennis clubs and that we all have a responsibility to contribute to the health and sustainability of our Association competitions if we want them to exist. Participation in local Association tennis leagues provides a strong foundation for the volunteer involvement and commitment that keep our community clubs going. As we update our structure and try to lessen the load on our incredible current committee members (who almost all have an equivalent role in a local community tennis club), and as we implement new committees and projects, there are roles (temporary or ongoing) for anyone, regardless of age or experience, that wants to be involved and make a contribution. Please contact me if you think you have something to offer.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

A major part of the position of Secretary is responding to the twice-yearly cycle of weekend competition, both the receiving and distributing of timely information at both ends of the season. It has been good to see the numbers of Junior competitions continue their recovery in numbers over the past few seasons. There have also been team number increases in both Mid Week Mens and Night Tennis.

The use of newer systems to aid in the collection and distribution of information is becoming a larger part of this position. We continue to look for better and more effective ways of communicating with clubs and teams. The Waverley website will continue to grow and have more information, of different types, available to be used as a resource for every member in the Association, whether you are a player or a club official.

We have been pleased to have the new President, Delyth Samuel, settle herself into the position held so ably by Mark Collins for many years. She has a different way of looking at the role, in several ways, and these will become more apparent to all as the months roll on, especially in the communications sphere as previously noted.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Operation income has remained consistent from FY23 to FY24. Whilst advertising and sponsorship from tournaments, grants, advertising & donations revenue fell, however is offset by improved Doveton Tennis Club profitability, increased focus on enforcing and collecting fines and sundry income.

Operating expenses have also remained largely consistent from FY23 to FY24. We have begun raising accruals to properly reflect outstanding expenses that were missed in prior years and there was also a drop in the overall expenditure of Doveton Tennis Club.

Honoraria expenses include \$7,500 of under accrual from FY23. The executive committee has gone through a process of reassessing how honoraria are determined and distributed across committee members. The amount paid to each committee member is based on time commitment, strategic direction and leadership required to fulfil their roles. WDTA honoraria are an honorary reward for voluntary services that are rendered by all the volunteers on the committee and are not considered a fee for any professional services that were voluntarily performed. The Waverley Development expense relates to \$5,000 that WDTA contributed to Newk's Tennis Camp as per last year, and there was no one-off large expenditure on items such as ClubMap (offset by an equivalent grant), that occurred in FY23, however we are in the process of properly updating WDTA's constitution and have engaged legal experts to ensure this is done correctly. The approximate cost will be \$5,000, with \$3,501 and offset against the Development Reserve.

The overall net loss of \$1,163 reflects WDTA's position as a non-for-profit association, with the money generated going to the benefit and development of the district and the clubs that are members, including: junior development, purchases of trophies, balls, tournaments, hosting of ceremonies and competition facilitation.

Throughout FY24, we have started cleaning up the accounting practices within MYOB and our reported Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss statements, including utilising the Development Fund and ensuring we account for expenses as they occur and raise accruals when we expect payment to occur in the future. There has been increased focus on outstanding debtor collection that has also seen a significant drop in debtors during the year.

The planned increase to the entry fees for teams from FY25 onwards and a decrease in the yearly club membership fee that will further support WDTA in the future. Please continue to let the committee know what we can do to invest in and make your clubs better as your tennis association.

Finally, WDTA is in the process of properly recognising Doveton Tennis Club as a subsidiary of WDTA in our accounts, with intercompany charges to occur to properly recognise the economic activity that occurs within the tennis club. We will aim to provide a subsidiary and consolidated view from FY25 onwards.

Weekend Competition

The 2023/2024 reporting period has been another solid year for all our weekend competitions, with team numbers shown below.

As ever, winter team entries are lower, with many of our players joining Vic Pennant competition for the Winter season.

For the first time, a Junior Sunday President's Cup section was run in the summer season as the standard is now similar to the top level Junior Saturday competition.

Open format has been the only senior doubles rubbers format option for the last two years and seems to have become accepted now.

Once again, our Record Secretaries have done an outstanding job. Thank you to Margaret Quigley, Tina Feely and David Kimberley for the many hours each week spent to ensure the competitions run smoothly and matches are played within our by-laws; and also for the onerous job of chasing up late match results and unregistered players/incomplete details, which can delay ladders being updated weekly.

David Kimberley has been Team Registrar once again and receives all team entries each season and keeps our historical statistical records of team numbers.

A big thank you for the support received from Delyth Samuel, Ian Chanter, Lindsay Coster and David Hocking.

It has been pleasing that the number of complaints has fallen significantly this year and the use of vests by Junior Supervisors for the first time has contributed to this positive situation.

The Hotline continues to assist those who have an issue needing clarification or if a difficult situation arises. Clubs are encouraged to use this facility if an issue cannot be resolved satisfactorily and can ensure an issue is resolved before it may escalate. All senior captains, junior supervisors and parents in your club should be made aware of this service.

The UTR rating system continues to be in operation with match scores being updated on a frequent basis (but not every week). The Match Committee and the Association get regular requests and communications on delay of UTR scores being updated and incorrect scores being entered on TROLS. Please communicate with your members that any requests for changed results will only be accepted via an authorised club official.

Weekend Competition (cont.)

It is essential scoresheets are entered neatly and with all emergency player details:

- full names,
- DOB (juniors),
- previous playing experience and UTR rating (if applicable).

If this procedure was followed, our Record Secretaries' workload would be reduced considerably.

We have an expectation that all clubs who enter teams in the current season of competition attend both Council Meetings and Senior and Junior Match Committee Meetings which occur during the currency of that season. An automatic fine is imposed on any club not in attendance. We were pleased to be able to offer \$100 lucky draws at each meeting during the reporting year, thanks to long-time Waverley Tennis supporter and sponsor, Tension 24.

It has again been a pleasure to have been Match Convenor this past year and I thank our committee and all club officials for all your valued assistance throughout the past 12 months. We welcome any club feedback on all match committee issues and have adopted many ideas from our member clubs.

Night Tennis

WDTA's Spring 2024 Night Tennis Competition has 7 competitions involving 49 teams from 22 clubs. WDTA's Spring 2023 Night Tennis Competition had 5 competitions involving 37 teams from 20 clubs.

WDTA is pleased to see that more tennis players are enjoying the benefits of playing night competition tennis on Mondays and Tuesdays.

On Monday nights, we currently have the one B 1 doubles comp.

On Tuesday nights, we currently have:

- A Reserve 1 and B 1 doubles comps, and
- A 1, A Reserve 1, A Reserve 2 and B Special triples comps

Night Tennis (cont.)

Doubles competitions require 4 players per team, each player playing 3 sets of doubles with each of their partners. Triples competitions require 3 players per team, each player playing 2 sets of doubles with each of their partners and 1 set of singles.

Sets for doubles and triples competitions are all first to 6 games. If a set gets to 6-5, the set is either won 7-5 or after a tiebreaker is played at 6-games all.

Flex Leagues

Flex Leagues are co-hosted by UTR and Waverley Tennis. In a nutshell, players are grouped with other players of similar ability and geographic location and get 4 matches to play in a 5-week period. Player use the UTR app to contact their opponents and organise the time and venue for their matches.

Waverley Tennis ran its first Flex League in March 2022 with 65 players. Since that time, we have run 16 leagues, 1 league is in progress and a further 3 are scheduled for 2024. Over 800 tennis players have participated in a league, with the number of players per league currently being 150 plus. The benefit of larger leagues is being able to place players groups with 0.5 or so UTR variation and in close proximity to other players in the league.

Whilst there were initially concerns that players would be “poached” from local competition to Flex Leagues, this has not proven to be true. Indeed, the leagues have provided a pathway for many players wanting to return to competitive tennis who might not have otherwise done so. Players that want more matches often play both and are encouraged to join a local club so they have a place to play (as opposed to hiring courts by the hour).

The revenue Waverley earns from Flex Leagues has provided opportunities to better fund and support junior tennis and pathways, including sponsoring our soon-to-be annual trip to Newks, providing younger players interested in the college tennis pathway the opportunity to take part in an organised trip to train and play at the John Newcombe Tennis Academy in Texas.

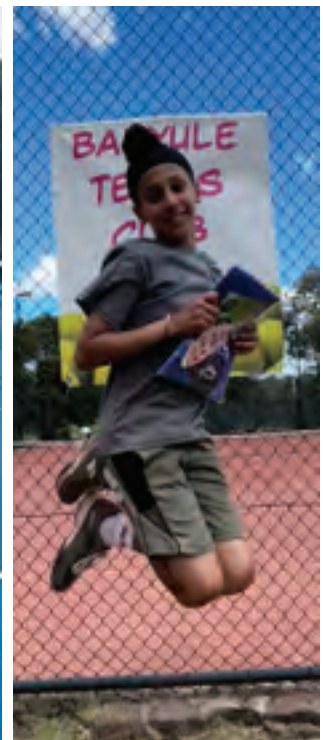

ASSOCIATIONS' TRIP TO NEWKS

Waverley Tennis took a group to Newks about 10 years ago and following that initiative and the interest in US College pathways, Waverley Tennis led the initiative to organise a trip there in September last year. The purpose of the trip was to provide interested junior players the opportunity to check out the US tennis scene, see what is involved in full-time training at an academy, learn more about college pathways and develop networks and connections that will help them with their tennis development. Importantly, it was also intended to give juniors a trip away from home without their parents, to both make it affordable and to give them a taste of what living away from home would entail, in a safe and supervised way.

Newks is an important provider of players into the US College system. They have around 60 full-time students and have an almost 100% success rate in placing players in college with tennis scholarships. Relationships with the coaches who can vouch for a player's ability, potential and character are important to opening doors to the right college in the US.



ASSOCIATIONS' TRIP TO NEWKS (Cont.)

Newks very generously provided a week free for winners at a tournament (initially called the Victoria Cup, now called the Association's Cup), to reflect that the trip is open to any junior who plays representative tennis across our Associations. They did the same for a tournament we held in December 2023, where some of the kids going on the September 2024 trip were able to get \$1500 off the price of the trip from the outset.

A great group of kids went on the September 2023 trip, from across a range of tennis associations and one player from Canberra, supervised by Delyth Samuel (President, Waverley Tennis) and Jason Lindeman (coach and committee for Northeast Junior Tennis Association (NEJTA)). We visited a variety of US colleges and met their coaches and players, learned how to play pickleball at the Country Club immediately adjacent to Newks, and trained and played a weekend UTR tournament in the Texas Heat. The 2023 group bought and ate every possible type of bad junk food and lollies they could get their hands on as part of their US experience. River floating on the day before we left was a great way to finish off the trip, in the cool spring water of the Comal river.

These financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

The Committee has agreed that the Association is not a reporting entity and therefore does not need to prepare detailed statutory financial statements.

Note 2: Make-up of Honoraria Expense

\$7,350 reflects additional expense as due to shortfall in accrual for FY23. \$35,000 Honoraria accrued for FY24 based on 15 committee members who have operated across 29 distinct roles.

Note 3: Legal Fees

Fees of \$3,501 have been incurred to date, to update the Waverley Tennis Constitution and have been allocated directly against the Development Fund.

Note 4: Income Tax

The Association is accepted as being exempt from Income Tax.

Note 5:

Waverley Tennis has financial control of Doveton Tennis Club and as such the Club accounts have been consolidated on a summary basis. Separate Club accounts are available on request.

INDEPENDENT REVIEW REPORT

To the Members of Waverley and District Tennis Association Inc.:

I have reviewed the accompanying financial report of Waverley and District Tennis Association Inc. (WDTA) which comprises Statement by Committee, Statement of Income & Expenditure, Statement of Assets & Liabilities and Notes to Financial Reports, for the year ended 30 June 2024.

The Committee's responsibility for the financial report

The Committee of WDTA are responsible for preparation of the financial report in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards and the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*. The committee determines internal controls that are necessary to enable the preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view and is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.


Conclusion
