Nicole Broadley will present about the use of two prescribed texts, Mary Shelley's "Frankenstein" and the Duffer Brothers' "Stranger Things," and the empowerment of student voices to participate in public conversations about the concepts of friendship, social inclusion and the dangers of exclusion in the IA1. Canadian expat Nicole Broadley (Bachelor of Arts UBC and Grad Diploma JCU) has been teaching English, Humanities and Study of Religion at Annandale Christian College for 10 years, and is the Head of English, Humanities and LOTE.

Susan McCosker and Nicole Broadley will present about honing students' authorial skills with a unit entitled, "Voices in the Past, Voice in the Present," in which students work with two texts set in the same time period, but in two very different circumstances and in very different genres, to consider the authorial choices being made in each. The unit was developed using a Cycle of Inquiry model to address the dreaded Year 9 plateau in student writing. Susan McCosker (Bachelor of Art, and Bachelor of Education JCU), previously a teacher at Cooloola Christian College, has been teaching at Annandale Christian College for three years, and has a keen interest in creative writing.
