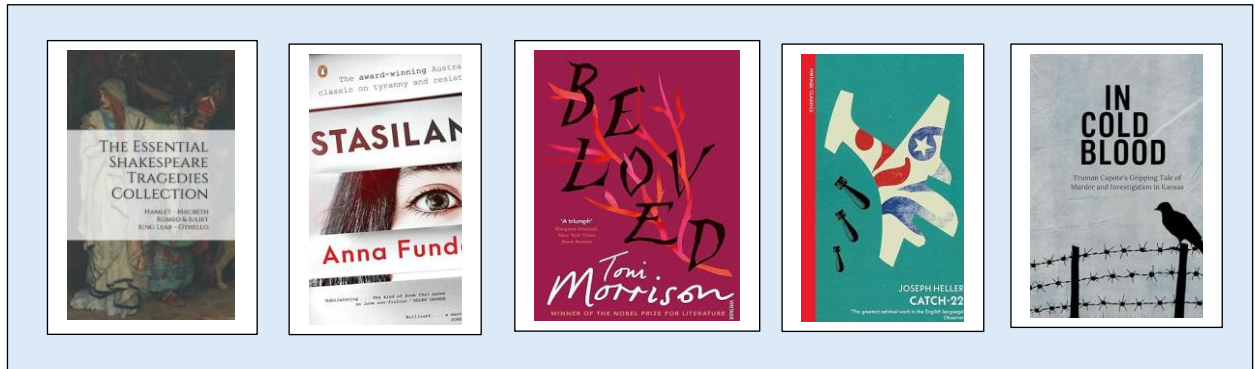

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Details of sessions

Session 1 Focusing on the IA1 and IA2: From Endorsement to Implementation - Carley Elliott

Abstract Together we will take a deep dive into the first two internal assessment instruments (with a slightly heavier focus on the IA2) and the triumphs we might encounter when tackling them. The session will be interactive and offer opportunities for participants to ask questions and share what they treasure about teaching Literature, including the texts that inspire us. Almost anything goes, so bring your burning questions, your love of Literature and literature, and a virtual smile!

Presenter

Carley Elliott has been teaching the QCAA senior subject Literature since its adoption in Queensland. She has been involved in all aspects of the syllabuses' implementation, both in schools and with QCAA in a variety of assessor roles. She is a passionate advocate for the incorporation of fantastic First Nations' texts, and for Literature (and literature) being accessible for all students who love reading and writing great texts.

Session 2 - Kylie Wilson-Tucker, QCAA will answer your questions

Session 3 - The inner space of character: Unit 3 Independent explorations IA3 creative writing.

Abstract Deb will share with you how she enables her students to experience and experiment with a variety of textual writing styles to help them identify their own authorial style. Deb's resource choices are underpinned by the 2025 Literature syllabus descriptors: Unit 3 and 4 Aesthetic features and stylistic devices "the more ... engagement with aesthetic dimensions of texts, the more they learn to read with their own writing in mind" (p. 10). A taste of Deb's choices – feminist poetry Christina Rossetti, Elizabeth Barret Browning; Modernist short story writer Katherine Mansfield, stream of consciousness writer Virginia Woolf and poet T.S. Eliot; free indirect discourse as a narrative technique to capture character thoughts, motivations and objectives.

Presenter:

Deb Owens is Head of English at St Ursula's College Yeppoon. She is the editor of ETAQ's journal *Words'Worth*. Deb teaches Literature, General English and Year 10 English. After being a Confirmer for General English, Deb moved to being a Confirmer for Literature in 2024.
