1st XI Cricket

Rostrevor 9/150 from 45 overs (**Patrick Shrestha** 35no, **Hugh Walker** 34, **Jack Hill** 29, **Guy Hutchinson** 16) defeated PAC 9/92 from 45 overs (**Patrick Shrestha** 2/14, **Dylan Smith** 2/16, **Murphy Short** 2/17).

A good result after the disappointment of last week in a game where we battled hard with the bat and bowled economically with the ball.

We finally managed to win a toss and bat first but were soon in trouble at 2/8 after **Josh Richards** was unlucky to be given out, caught behind and **Harrison Rahaley** fell not long afterwards. A crucial 3rd wicket partnership between **Hugh Walker** and **Jack Hill**, took the score to 66 before **Jack Hill** was run out; which was unfortunate as he was batting really well. From that point, we lost wickets at quite regular intervals just as we felt as though the momentum would shift our way. The PAC bowlers bowled well; however, we still need to be smarter about how we bat the middle overs. At 7/97, we looked like we were in trouble until a couple of important partnerships towards the end of the innings brought the game back our way. On a very slow un-Rostrevor like outfield, we managed to reach 9/150, which was probably worth closer to 200 given the slowness of the outfield. **Patrick Shrestha** and **Luke Valente** put on 42 for the 8th wicket and a couple of nice hits from **Ned McKay** got us to a very competitive total. Shrestha was our top scorer with 35no and we received good contributions from **Jack Hill** (29) and **Hugh Walker** (34).

In reply, our goal was to put real pressure on with the new ball by bowling as many dot balls as possible and build the pressure. This plan worked well with **Patrick Shrestha** and **Dylan Smith**, again doing the job with the new ball for the 3rd week in a row. PAC lost wickets regularly and the game was effectively dead at 4/25. As the day wore on, the pitch became flatter and taking wickets was much more difficult. I was really proud of the way that all of the bowlers bowled to the plan and we were tidy in the field, with **Josh Richards** setting the standard behind the stumps. Smith, Shrestha and **Murphy Short** all finished with 2 wickets. We look forward to Scotch next week in a game that will have a large bearing on how we progress in the State Knockout competition.
