

place at the University of South Australia's Mawson Lakes campus on Tuesday 12 November. It was engaging, encouraging informative excursion that really pushed our problem solving abilities. We were given the opportunity to experience how it would be if we were to enrol in degrees and careers of an engineer. We were able to solve complex puzzles and problems as various Nanograms, Skyscraper Sudokus, and puzzles that have existed since the times of King Charlemagne.





After a morning tea break, we experimented with air pressure and

speed in a session about aviation; expanding our understanding of how aviation and aerodynamics work. Our third session, after lunch, consisted of an engineering lesson and competition. The aim was to build a tower over a metre high, using only 50cm of sticky tape and two sheets of A4 paper. St Dom's produced two towers. The runner up group, Jaida, Anya, Maddie, Thinesa and Tahlia, created a tower that stood 118cm high. The winning group was just 4 centimeters higher at 122cm, built by Brooke, Millie, Lauren, Sara and Naomi.
