Dear Parents / Guardians,

It is reasonable to suggest that the week of St Dominic's celebrations was perhaps the coldest we have had this year. The morning frost had us all reaching for our scarves and gloves as we longed for the brief midday sun that warmed pockets of the school.

On Tuesday we huddled in the gymnasium, as well as possible, given the social distancing in place. Our invited guests prayed with us from a distance, as we asked them to stay home to be sure they were safe and well. Before Mass began the Senior Choir stood in the driveway of the Convent and sang with gentle conviction the *Hymn to St Dominic*. There was pride in the voices of the girls and joy in the faces of the Sisters. The words swirled around all who were gathered, settling only to resonate in our hearts ... *'Loved and honoured, loved and honoured, leading us to greater faith.'*

Beautifully prepared by Genevieve Taheny and her team, the Mass unfolded with reverence; drawing us all into the Word of God, which drifted toward us from around the beautifully decorated gymnasium. Our choirs were delightful, leading us in song and praise. Student voice was powerful in prayer, reflection and thanksgiving. Lauren O'Callaghan and Justyna Dutka reflected on the Gospel and reminded us to be women who look forward – to walk with others just as Dominic did. *"And just as Jesus taught in today's gospel reading, Dominic walked and walked. He never looked back toward his old life, always forward, toward the fruition of God's kingdom."* From Reception to Year 12, students celebrated the life of St Dominic, our inspiration and our guide, as we seek to live as Jesus calls us.

I had the great privilege of having morning tea with our 9 International students and Mrs Georgia Meyer (Counsellor and International Student Coordinator). It was a delightful gathering where the girls told me a little of their story, their joy at being a student at St Dominic's and their hopes for the future. I was impressed by their optimism and their commitment to their studies.

The Primary Assembly, hosted by Year 4, was a showcase of learning. We heard about Isaac Newton, the life of a turtle and we travelled the world with expert tour guides. I enjoyed the girls' beautiful confidence as they read their scripts carefully and clearly. The prayer drew our attention to the lives of significant saints and the girls paid tribute to our Patron St Dominic, along with Australia's first saint, Mary MacKillop whose feast day was celebrated on 8 August. It was especially lovely to see some parents joining us.

No doubt you would have seen recent news reports in regards to Thebarton Senior College. Under the direction of SA Health, Thebarton College was advised to close for this week. Students who attend Thebarton but are enrolled in other schools were also advised by SA Health if they were required to self-isolate. At St Dominic's we continue to follow the advice offered by SA Health, who are doing an outstanding job in keeping South Australia safe during this most difficult time.

This week you will have received information regarding Parent Teacher Discussions for Reception to Year 12 students set for Tuesday 25 August and Monday 7 September. Due to COVID-19 our first round of Parent Teacher Discussions were conducted over the phone. We recognise the value of face to face meetings with your daughter's teachers and we have put COVID-19 safe practices in place in order for parents to attend the College site in this capacity. These practices include, physical distancing, no handshakes, short interviews and unfortunately no refreshments will be served. We will be vigilant with the number of people gathered in the Hall and Gymnasium at any one time. I ask that parents who opt to have interviews at this time, support our processes and procedures.

Important information to families regarding a curriculum change at the College will be forwarded to families via email this Friday. In the meantime, Year 7 to 11 students will soon be bringing home their 2021 subject selection forms. I am pleased to inform you that next year we are able to offer three new SACE subjects at Year 11 and 12; Stage One Psychology (Year 11) and Stage Two Health & Wellbeing, and Child Studies (Year 12). Year 10 and 11 families will be notified shortly about booking a time on Thursday 27 August to meet with their daughters' Home Class teacher to finalise their subject choices. This is an important time for students to consider their future pathways. The girls will receive excellent counselling to assist in their subject choices as they plan the final years of their Secondary school life. Parents are encouraged to attend this event with their daughter/s.

As the cold winter air remains just a little longer, may we find time to give thanks for the rain, for the warmth of our homes and for the joy in knowing the days are getting longer. Enjoy those sunrises!

In the Book of Revelation, we read of Jesus "Behold I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door I will come in and eat with them and they with me."

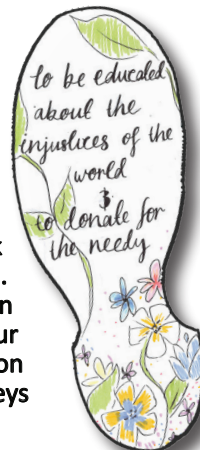
If through the white noise of modern life, you hear Jesus calling you, take this perspective: There is nothing you are doing that could possibly be more important than going to the door and opening it.

News from the SECONDARY SCHOOL

YEAR 12 COORDINATOR'S REPORT

Our Year 12 girls are on the home stretch in terms of their academic year. There are eight teaching weeks remaining after the current one. Whilst this end point may be a source of relief for some, others may feel a heightened sense of apprehension as exams and final assessments approach. More than ever, this is the time for our girls to tap into their support networks, seek that extra help they need from a teacher, lean on a friend or be the one to offer support to a classmate who needs it.

PLANNING FOR A FUTURE BEYOND SCHOOL

A large focus in Pastoral Care sessions remaining in this term will be guiding and assisting girls as they navigate their way through this process of formalising their 2021 pathway. Students seeking extra guidance are encouraged to make an appointment with our Careers Counsellor Ms Eustace. She is a wonderful resource and has a calm manner that helps allay the fears many girls bring to her.

The girls have been encouraged to aim high, be bold, and have lofty aspirations. But they also need to be true to themselves. Course preferences need to, at their core, reflect the interests and capacity of the student. A university pathway straight out of school is not the *only* option available and indeed may not be the *best* option for some girls at this time. As such we encourage the girls to have the courage to map out their own post school pathway, whatever form this takes.

THE FUTURE OF SCHOOL COMPLETION MEASUREMENT

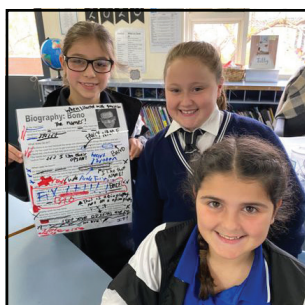
The current system of measuring student achievement at the conclusion of their schooling is dominated by the Australian Tertiary Admission Rank [ATAR]. Four digits that purport to capture 13 years of school education. Four digits that drive students, that distress students, that, as it stands, open up pathways for students and shut them as well. Whilst statistically reliable, educators have been agitating for some time for a 'better way.'

The recently published '**Shergold Review**' – the national review by the Education Council into Australian senior secondary education notes that, "*the heavy focus on scholastic performance is seen by students to pay too little regard to the other skills and attributes that they require for successful adulthood.*"

Later this month the SACE Board's new **Strategic Plan** is being unveiled. Much effort has been invested into investigating how a broader sense of a student's knowledge, skills and abilities can be recorded. A 'Learner Profile' is being developed that is not simply a narrow reporting system that crunches scholastic metrics, but a mechanism whereby 'soft skills' can be officially recognised as complementing the data available of academic achievement. These skills include critical thinking, creativity and ethical understanding; attributes desirable to employers and necessary in the world our St Dominic's students are entering into.

Whether you are in frequent contact with your daughter's teachers or have never rung the school once in your time as a parent here, your contact is both welcomed and encouraged, particularly in the critical weeks ahead for our senior students.
