and we can see through them, and the cubby house roof is made of metal to keep the rain out.



How to claim a catholic schools discount

In order to claim this discount the onus will be on parents each year to complete and return to the school a "Sibling Discount for Children Attending Another Catholic School" form by Friday 25th November 2016. The pink form is included in this week's bulletin.

Annual school fees will be billed in Term 1 but are payable in equal instalments over the first three terms as follows:


