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Dear Parents,

Last Wednesday's final meetings for the Parents and Friends and the Fete Committee were a real chance to look back at the contributions Parents have made to the welfare of your children here at St. Dominic's during 2017.

At the Parents and Friends meeting Co Presidents Jo Duffy and Michelle Hogan presented an account of times shared at many functions from the Family Mass right through to the Fete. I thought as I listened just how lucky we are to have the service of parent leaders who give that extra time to keep alive the spirit of community which is so characteristic of St. Dominic's. Financially both the P&F and the Fete have injected much needed funds to assist us in the development of our new Year 12 Centre, the future ELC and development of our present campus.

You will be pleased to know that the Fete result for 2017 was \$61,734. This figure was up by \$5,000 on the year before and on a par with 2015. When we add the Fete and the other P&F fundraising the total is over \$88,000. Reports from stall holders demonstrated that when the weather is warmer different stalls are affected some up (mostly), and others a little down. Special thanks was expressed at the Fete meeting to Year 12 parents some of whom have been convenors of stalls since their daughters began in Year 8 or in Primary. To Scott Griffin, to Noreen Pardoe and to Kathryn Hudson, who master mind from behind, and lead from the front, we are greatly indebted to you. Thanks also to Stuart Lapsley for learning the ropes as Scott's no. 1 support.

There is one comment I would like to pass on from the P&F to new parents. One of the Co-Presidents made the point that it can appear from the smooth running of our events that in fact we do not need extra support. That is not how things really are. We do need new parents to step up, and I would urge new parents and those who have been with us for 2-3 years to join a committee or attach your organisational skills to one event as part of a team. Thank you.

Twilight Assembly: Congratulations to our R-5 students and their wonderful teachers and support staff on the great start to Christmas at last night's Twilight Assembly. From the opening carol "Silent Night" to the Reception class Nativity play and everything in between it was a fabulous show.
