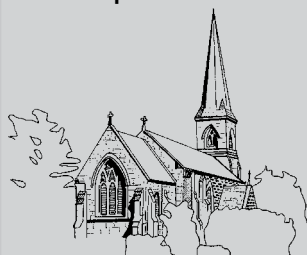

Year 11's Memorable Trip to Canberra

20 Year 11 students escaped Adelaide's "warm" weather to face the cold weather of Canberra. Setting off after lunch on the 25th of July, anticipation was high on the plane's atmosphere for the fun and memorable five days ahead.

We visited many attractions: *The Australian Institute of Sport (AIS), Questacon, the National Gallery of Australia, CSIRO, Old Parliament House, Parliament House, the Australian War Memorial, the National Library of Australia, Mount Ainslie, the Australian Defence Force Academy (ADFA), Black Mountain Tower, and the High Court of Australia.*



The most memorable and enduring activity was the bike ride around Lake Burley Griffin. A 16km ride that allowed us to view many beautiful views of Canberra and a chance for us to feel the fresh Canberra wind against our faces. It was definitely worth having sore aching bodies that we had to endure the next few days.

These Year 11 Student from our St Dominic's have recently undertaken this educational tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$60 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs.



Youth Parliament

Earlier this year, I was lucky enough to be chosen as a South Australian Youth Parliamentarian. Run by the YMCA of South Australia, this is an apolitical program that empowers young people to become advocates for their community. Also aiming to connect politicians and decision makers with youth voices and opinions, as well as providing youth leadership training and opportunities for personal development.

For the past semester, my team and I have been writing a Bill for an Act to provide youth with essential skills for adulthood through a new 'Life-skills' lesson, ironically named the *#Adulging Bill*.

During the first week of the school holidays, I attended a residential camp where I debated my bill and the many others in Parliament House. The topics of the bills debated included *introducing restrictions on caged eggs, removing the gay provocation defence and creating and using nuclear power in South Australia*, among many more topics that the youth of South Australia are passionate about!

I am extremely proud to say that the *#Adulging Bill* passed in the House of Assembly, and will now be distributed to government officials who have the power to enact this as a law.

I would like to thank Sr Jillian Havey and the College for their sponsorship of me through this program, as well as the ongoing support and ideas I have received from students and staff.

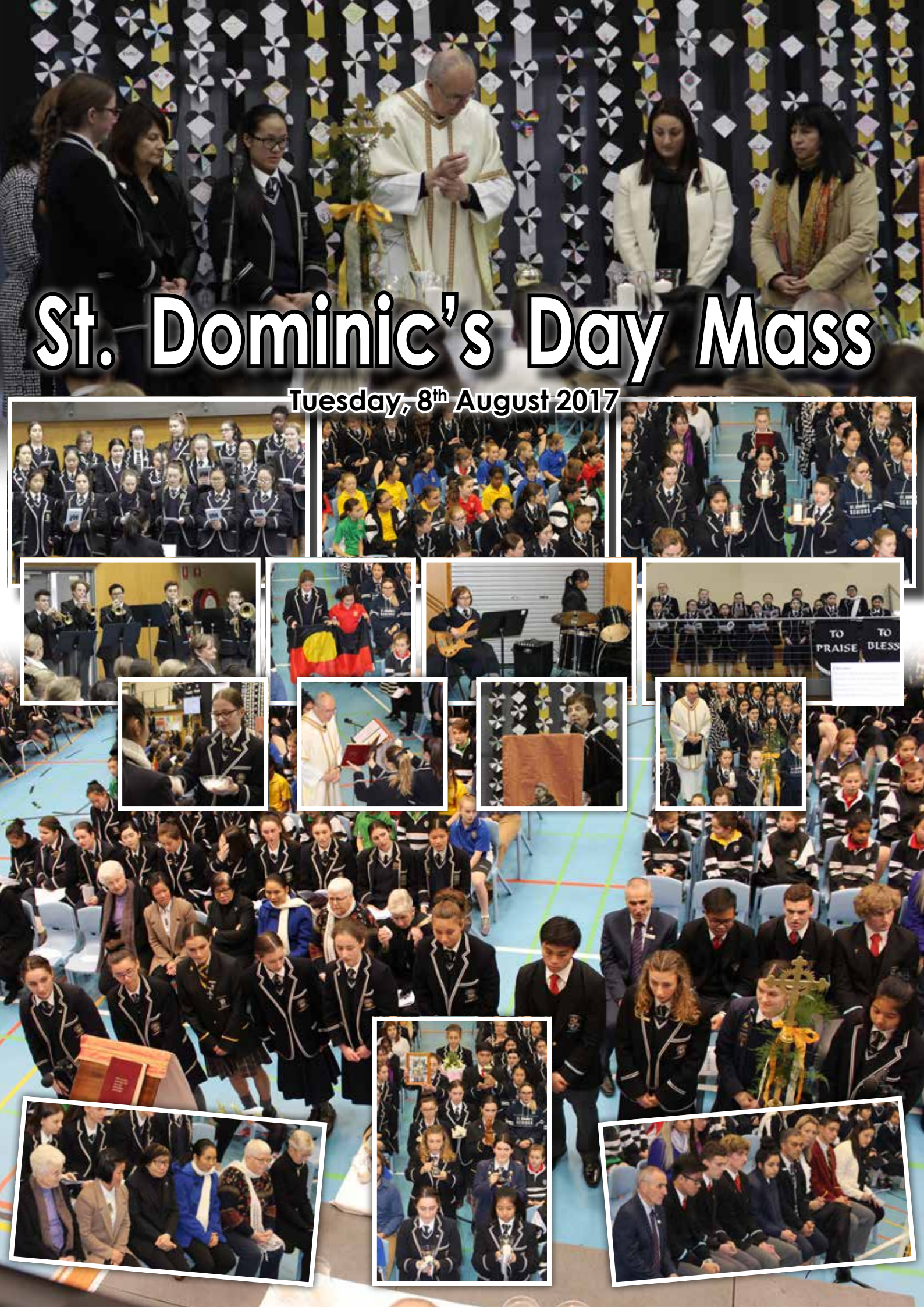

Aurecon Competition

On Tuesday 1st August, two teams of Year 9 students travelled to the Art Gallery of SA to compete in the STEM initiative, the South Australian Aurecon Bridge Building Competition. The teams were "The Dominators", consisting of *Christabelle Budiman*, *Mary Lumapas* and *Lynh Le*, and "Triple S", consisting of *Sarah-Quynh Nguyen*, *Sarah Runneger-Mullins* and *Stephanie Pham*. The girls competed against approximately 40 teams from other schools around the state.



Five weeks ago, every team was provided with the same materials (balsa wood, string and cardboard) in order to create a bridge that would support the heaviest weight. The girls spent lunchtimes researching, designing and constructing their bridges.

On competition day bridges were put on the testing apparatus and loaded up. Every team's efforts were applauded even if it supported less than a kilogram. Both of St Dominic's bridges were rapidly rising to overtake first place, but a joint failure on one bridge, and buckling on the other bridge meant they fell short. We congratulate The Dominators and Triple S for achieving 2nd and 3rd place. Whilst the bridges only weighed just over 200gms, they supported 78kg and 63.9kg respectively - over 300 times their own weight.

For coming second, The Dominators won \$500 for the school and a \$50 voucher each for themselves. I would like to thank the girls for their marvellous efforts, their enthusiasm and dedication. I also look forward to St Dominic's successfully meeting the challenge again next year with two new teams of Year 9s.
