INSPIRING MELISSA RUNS A MARATHON INTO OUR HISTORY BOOKS!

In 2016, Gleeson Old Scholar Melissa Haynes (Class of 2007) achieved an amazing feat, becoming the first Australian chronic sufferer of Cystic Fibrosis to complete a marathon! Melissa was also recently awarded a 2016 Pride of Australia medal for her outstanding work raising awareness and funds for a cure for CF!

Proving that her medical condition is no barrier to reaching your dreams, Melissa completed the gruelling 42km Adelaide Marathon in three hours and 37 minutes in August. As a passionate advocate in the crusade for a cure for CF, Mel has raised more than \$23,000 for Cure4CF Foundation and is hoping her story will raise awareness in the community.

The Advertiser Newspaper and Channel 9 News both highlighted Mel's achievement, and below is an excerpt from an article by 9 News:

"When times did get tough (on the marathon course), I just thought of the many CF angels in the sky and that got me through," Melissa told 9 News.

"I just hope one day I'll be able to say I used to have cystic fibrosis," she said.

Associate Professor David Parsons from Adelaide University said he was "astounded" at Ms Haynes' abilities.

"It's amazing that someone living with CF-lungs is able to contemplate it, let alone do it," he said.

PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS > 2016 Presentation Evening

It is my absolute privilege to be able to speak to you this evening as Principal of this exceptional school.

I wonder if you have heard the story of Sherlock Holmes and Dr. Watson who decide to go on a camping trip. After dinner, they lay down for the night, and go to sleep. Some hours later, Holmes wakes up and says to his faithful friend.

"Watson, look up at the sky and tell me what you see."

Watson replied, "I see millions of stars." "What does that tell you?"

Watson pondered for a minute.

"Astronomically, it tells me that there are millions of galaxies and potentially billions of planets."

"Astrologically, I observe Saturn is in Leo."
"Horologically, I deduce that the time is approximately a quarter past three."

"Theologically, I can see that God is all powerful and that we are small and insignificant."

I have extremely high expectations and I ask a lot of these people, and they simply never let me down. We are called the Leadership Team and

that is exactly what we are. So thank you to Mr O'Connor, Mr Corbo and Dr Knight, Mrs Smith, Mrs Price, Mr Bertram and Mr Cibich. You are an unbelievable source of inspiration to me.

I would like to acknowledge another inspirational group of people - the teaching and ESO staff of Gleeson College, who I continually see striving to inspire the young people in their care. Tonight is also a celebration of your commitment to your vocation. Thank you all for your incredible work. We have a wonderful tradition at Gleeson College of recognising the staff that have provided 15 years of service to our community and their names are on an honour board in our staff room. This year we also are able to recognise six staff who have contributed 25 years of service to Gleeson. This is a remarkable achievement. So tonight we acknowledge Carol Hamilton, Jeanine Fielding, Maria Gagliardi, Tim Knight, Helen Gillen and the recently retired Ben Dwiar. 25 years deserves a round of applause!

I also take this opportunity to say thank you to the staff who are either retiring from Gleeson College or moving onto other positions. We thank you for your service to our community and wish you all the very best for future. There are also a number of new staff who have been appointed for 2017 here with us this evening and we warmly welcome them to the Gleeson College community. You never know perhaps they too will make 25 years!

My sincere thanks the College Board for their careful stewardship and guidance. We have such a wonderful group of dedicated and enthusiastic Board members. In particular, I recognise our two retiring members, Valerie Altieri and Vera Ierace. Both Valerie and Vera have made a significant contribution to our College community and we thank them most sincerely for their selfless commitment to the betterment of our school. I particularly wish to acknowledge and thank the Chairperson of the College Board Mr Peter Stewart for his work, wise counsel and unwavering support and enthusiasm. It is great working with you Peter and something that I value as professionally rewarding.

Thank you to the Gleeson Parents and Friends committee once again led so



enthusiastically by Kelly Martin and Elizabeth Thompson. What a positive, brilliant group of people. It is well known that active engagement of parents in a school is vital to the ongoing success of the community, so thank you to the P&F for all of your hard work and dedication as it is a key ingredient to the success of our school. I know that the P&F would welcome involvement from any other interested parents.

I once again thank Monsignor John Swann who is incredibly generous with his time by celebrating the many whole School, House, staff and class masses; I was delighted to present his Minster for Education award earlier this evening. Monsignor Swann has been supported in this work by our Parish Priest and Board President Fr. James. We have also been fortunate to have Fr Manu from Modbury Para Hills and Fr Leo from TTG support our masses this year. Thank you to each of you for your support of Gleeson College and for nurturing the spiritual dimension of our College.

Thank you also to Catholic Education South Australia; and in particular to Mr Mark Corrigan our Principal Consultant who is with us here this evening. I have greatly appreciated Mark's wisdom, guidance and advocacy for our College and his support of me personally has been exceptional this year.

We have achieved a great deal this year and it is important to reflect on these achievements.

Obviously one of the key developments this year was the announcement that Gleeson College will offer Year 7 enrolment in 2018 and beyond. This represents the most significant structural change to our school, since it began in 1989. Much work and planning has already taken place, and I am indebted to my amazing Leadership Team who have supported

me in this crucial work. Next year shapes as an exciting year of further planning to ensure that the transition is as successful as possible. One of the most pleasing and positive aspects of this initiative has been the genuine and respectful relationships forged and strengthened between Gleeson, St Francis Xavier's, Saint David's and Our Lady of Hope. We continue to develop authentic links to our partner primary schools as we look to new and creative ways to foster genuine partnership, and as such I recognise Principal of SFX Leonie De Garis, as well as Kathy Zed and newly appointed Principal Leanne Lawler from Saint David's, who are all here with us this evening, as well as Ashley Keane from OLOH. I have loved working with these people as leaders and colleagues that I hold in high regard. We are all committed to ensuring the very best learning environments possible for the families in this region and we are going to make the transition of Year 7 from the Primary to Secondary setting a great success.

The completion of the College Master Plan was a significant achievement in 2016. Edge Architects have been able to develop our educational brief into an exciting vision for capital development for the future. Four distinct Stages have been identified including the Year 7 precinct, a new senior school centre, a Chapel capable of seating 350 people and the redevelopment and extension of the administration building. The master plan has been endorsed by the South Australian Commission for Catholic Schools and Stage 1, the Year 7 building, is currently in the documentation stage. Work will begin on this project in Term 1 next year and will be completed by the end of 2017. It is very exciting times! I spent some time with the Middle School Leaders last week outlining the master plan and they were extremely excited by the vision and possibilities that lav ahead. In the last 12 to 18 months we have also worked hard to refresh a number of areas around the College including the refresh of the admin building, the new courtyard and refurbishing all of the student toilets. I am telling you these toilets are something else and are the best I have seen in a school! I acknowledge the work of our brilliant Business Manager, Mr Paul O'Connor, both with this work and also his astute financial management and planning that enables us to be in the



position that we are to move ahead with our capital development.

Again we have offered a huge range of extra-curricular activities for students to be a part of. Performing Arts, sports, Tetreats, camps, excursions, NT Immersion Trip, STEM Club and many others. A key success this year has been the 're-igniting' of our World Football Specialist Program. Travis Dodd has been outstanding in his leadership and coaching of both the program and Twilight Team. Winning the Twilight competition for the first time was just reward for all the hard work and commitment of both the players and staff. Our Year 8/9 boys also won both indoor and outdoor competitions. Regardless of success however, our students always represent this school with pride and distinction and are wonderful ambassadors. Our Performing Arts program continues to flourish, and the quality of music, dance, drama and art for our students is simply breathtaking. You have already seen some of this on show this evening.

A key focus for our professional learning in 2017 is ensuring that the transition of Year 7 students is indeed a success, including the successful construction of the Stage 1 build. Other key professional learning projects that the College will be involved with include the 'Enhancing Catholic Schools Identity Project' with Leuven University in Belgium, the use

of data to inform pedagogy with Curtin University, a joint project with Pedare, GGHS and University of SA focussed on literacy interventions and a continuation of our schoolwide pedagogy project with the University of Southern Queensland. Again busy but exciting times!

If there was one event this year however that I had to single out that captured the magic of the Gleeson College community it was the Mass that was held on Gleeson Day, the last day of Term 3. We were privileged to have Archbishop Gleeson's brother Ray and his niece Margaret in attendance. We invited Ray up on stage and the whole College sang Happy Birthday for his 85th birthday, and presented him with a gift and birthday cake (see photo above). It was just a beautiful moment in time. It meant so much to our school that Ray was able to join us and connect us with his brother who we aspire to make proud every day that we come to this school. We never forget that Archbishop Gleeson left us with the hope that Gleeson College will always be of "One Heart" in every aspect of its life and mission. This challenge drives us as a community and is central to our purpose and being. It leads us to the question of what does Archbishop Gleeson's call mean to each and every individual that comprises our community. What are we called to do as a staff member, a student and a parent? If there

are there aspects of our commitment to this community that require change, what do we do about this? Are we Dr Watson who is looking for the perfect answer and in doing so missing the obvious and immediate response? Pope Francis often challenges us in the same way.

All of these innovations I have outlined are so important for our College in order to continuously improve. We do live in interesting times and schools are always a mirror of society. The digital age that we live in is awesome and amazing - but it also comes with many pitfalls. We are constantly charting interesting waters and schools cannot do everything even though it seems that they are being called to. Young people's mental health and wellbeing are constantly challenged. When people ask me how schools have changed over my 24 years of teaching there is no doubt that the proliferation of social media has altered relationships between young people and the world. I am amazed at how often schools are called upon to resolve issues that have occurred outside of school due to inappropriate use of social media. We could in once sense say it is not our responsibility, but when these issues impact the wellbeing of the students in our care we feel a great responsibility to support and be involved. We also rely heavily on support from parents. Really when it all boils down this is all we have, strong authentic and respectful relationships between school and home to achieve our aims. So thank you to you the families who constantly support our endeavours to provide the best culture and conditions for your children to thrive.


Kara Turner (Class of 1997) Fights Back a Winner!


