Although it can be challenging to always accept the news we receive, we should ask ourselves why that person chose us as the recipient and what our response means to them. 'Tis the season for New Year's resolutions. This year, resolve to show support and acceptance to those who bring us their news.

For Vocations

A new Vocations Prayer program will be introduced at St. Edward's Parish, commencing this weekend January 26th/27th. Families or individuals will be invited to take into their home, for one week, a "Travelling Chalice". This chalice belonged to a priest, Fr. Lorne Edward MacFarland, Scarborough Foreign Missions (1911-1976). He was born in 1911, and served in the Missions of China and Japan, as well as ministry in Canada. This chalice travelled with him. Today, it is provided to families and individuals who are invited to take it in their homes for one week and to pray for all priests, deacons, sisters, and religious, and for all future vocations. A prayer booklet will be made available to assist you in your prayers.

A sign-up sheet, with the week you desire, in 2019, will be available at the back of the church. The chalice will be presented each weekend at the Mass the family or individual normally attends and is returned for the following weekend. We hope this will be a wonderful spiritual opportunity for all.
