

Do you have a best friend? How much would you be willing to pay for your friendship?


- Would you speak up when others are saying bad things about your friend, even if you knew it would make you unpopular?

- You and your friend plan to go to the movies on Saturday. If the most popular person in your class asked you to a special party that night and didn't invite your friend, what would you do?




some ideas to make this week truly holy and to deepen the whole family's understanding of Jesus' love.


If your parish is having the Stations on Good Friday, go as a family. Help the children to follow what is happening and to pray each Station.


