The second disciple said: "He asked us what we were talking about. We were surprised he didn't know. Everyone in Jerusalem was talking about Jesus."

After they told the stranger that they were discussing Jesus, the stranger started explaining the Scriptures to them. He told them how the Scriptures were really all about Jesus.

"It was beautiful just to listen to him," both disciples agreed.

The stranger walked all the way to Emmaus with them. When they arrived, the disciples didn't want him to stop talking, so they invited him to eat with them.

"He agreed to stay awhile," said one disciple. "As soon as he broke the bread, we both recognized him. It was lesus!"

"Yes! It was the oddest thing," said the other disciple. "Then he just vanished into thin air."

"Really? What did you do then?" they were asked.

"We ran right back here to Jerusalem to tell you!" "But it's seven miles! Do you mean to tell me you ran seven miles in the dark? That's amazing!"

How often do we fail to recognize
Jesus in others? Perhaps it takes a special way of looking. Here are some ideas for the class or family to discuss this week.

Remember how Jesus fed the five thousand with a few loaves and fish? Think of the neighbor who is always first to bring in a casserole or pie when someone is sick. Do you see Jesus there?

Remember how Jesus helped the blind to see and the deaf to hear? Think about someone you know or have read about who spends time working to help someone with a disability. Do you see Jesus there?

Remember when Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me"? Think about a friend or neighbor who always has time to spend with children. Do you see Jesus there?

Remember how Jesus raised Lazarus from the grave? Think about the people who are always there to cheer you when you feel sad or to help you when you are in trouble. Do you see Jesus there?

Remember how Jesus told Martha that Mary had chosen the "better part" because she liked to sit and listen to him? Think about yourself and your prayer time. Do you see Jesus there?

It isn't hard to recognize Jesus as he lives in your life every day. All it takes is to really know him and how his love works through you and others.



HOW MUCH

The two disciples on the road to Emmaus were so happy to have seen Jesus that they traveled seven miles on a dark and dangerous road to share the news. How far would you go to let others know that Jesus lives in your life? Would you go as far as the children in the following stories?

Then Susan told the children that Jesus loves the little girl, and whatever they do to that child, they are also doing to him. She said they were just like the soldiers who whipped Jesus and laughed at him and put the crown of thorns on his head.

After a while, the children began listening to Susan. One of the boys told the little girl he was sorry and he promised not to tease her anymore.

Richard Newmes recently went out of his way to let others know that Jesus lives in his heart. Richard pitches for the Crusaders, this year's championship baseball team from Saint Joseph's School. The Crusaders were honored at the state capital. The boys had a lot of fun on the three-hour bus ride to the capital.

The banquet was a grand affair with teams from schools all across the state receiving trophies. For dinner there were steaks and baked potatoes and green beans. It all looked so good and the boys were very hungry after their long ride. They sat down and started eating that delicious meal right away.

Then Richard spoke up: "Wait. Don't start eating yet. We haven't said grace."

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
Jesus promised that he would be with us always — and he is. It takes a little practice, but your family can learn to recognize him in the people and things around you. Here are some ideas.



After he died on the cross and rose again from the dead, Jesus was very close to his friends, even when they didn't know it.


When two of his friends were walking from Jerusalem to Emmaus, they talked together about Jesus, whom they loved very much. "Where is Jesus now?" they wondered.

A stranger fell in step with them, "What are you talking about?" he asked. "We are speaking of Jesus," they said. "He came in love but died on the cross."


Then the stranger began to tell them stories from the Bible. Before they knew it, they were in Emmaus. "Come eat with us," they asked him.
