Dear Brothers,

Our first and principal rule has always been the New Testament, the source of our hope and inspiration. We no longer use various verses as "proof texts" because we know that the Gospels are highly structured literary works, in which the words and works of Jesus recalled by the evangelists are ordered in ways to ponder the profundity of his mission. The Gospels demand a response on the part of the reader/listener. The meaning of the words and actions of Jesus' stories, arranged into new literary contexts, are deepened by that context.

It would seem that Matthew's main interest was in writing for small groups of "two or three" initiates at Antioch helping them to find the meaning of their inner personal experience of walking with the resurrected Jesus. Matthew wanted to lead his readers along the path to continual conversion and not merely inform them of some of the events of the life of Jesus.

Jesus' plea to pray to the Lord of the harvest for new reapers (**Matt. 9:36**), the reason for our monthly Vocation Prayers, comes as the climax of a narrative that begins with Chapter 8. In this narrative, Jesus becomes aware of the depths and the challenges of his mission, which he cannot do on his own. Matthew inserts Jesus' plea to pray the Lord of the harvest for reapers and leaves his readers with a time for silent reflection to meditate on the problem. Using the creative power of a prophet, Matthew, the literary artist, shows those he is instructing that the answer to this prayer, in his case, was the calling of the Apostles and that the answer to their prayers for future 'reapers' would always within the local groups!

Matthew invites his readers with 'a hiatus of silence' to inner growth and, beyond their expectations, calls them to become 'reapers of the harvest', to venture into the unknown like "sheep among wolves". Once the community asks the Lord of the harvest for 'reapers' the community accepts the responsibility for solving this same problem that faced Jesus. Possessing the Spirit, the followers of Jesus are empowered with skills to develop communities of faith, because having been taught how to pray for 'their daily bread' they are awake to the realities of their local situation and not afraid to speak the truth, they can respond positively to new pastoral needs of the 'shepherd-less sheep'.

It is important for us to realise that the responsibility for recruitment of new 'reapers' rests with all members of our associated Lasallian communities. "There is an urgent need, especially nowadays, for a more widespread and deeply felt conviction that all the members of the Church, without exception, have the grace and responsibility to look after vocations" (PDV, par.41). However, those we ask to join us in this search can only be successful if we accompany them on their prayer journey and talk with them about prayer as Jesus did with his disciples. They must learn how to pray privately and communally, modelling for one another the prayer Jesus taught us. This is something new for many of us. We are invited to be companions of those who sing "a new song to the Lord" (Ps. 97.1).

Enjoy the season of new life with its new sounds after the dreary days of winter and be awake to those the Lord is calling to join us in this project of prayer for new 'reapers' to continue the mission.

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INTRODUCTION: REMEMBRANCE OF THE PRESENCE OF GOD:

PSALMODY: Psalm 145(146) (Gelineau)

Commentary: When we recite this psalm, we join with our Jewish elder brothers and sisters throughout the world in their morning prayer. Written in post-exilic times, the People of God state in definite terms that trust alone can be placed in Yahweh, who is all-powerful as the Creator of the Universe. This power is only a pale symbol of God's faithfulness. Not even the most powerful of men and women can determine the course of history. Our God embraces the afflicted, those reduced to poverty and slavery, the sick and those who are helpless and unprotected, especially the strangers in our midst who have no citizenship rights. This is a reminder for us to pray for refugees who have been abandoned to a life of uncertainty, unable to flourish as human beings.

Alleluia!

My soul, give praise to the LORD; I will praise the LORD all my life, sing praise to my God while I live. Put no trust in princes, in mortal man who cannot save.

Take their breath, they return to the earth,

and their plans that day come to nothing.

Blessed is he who is helped by Jacob's God, whose hope is in the LORD his God, who made the heavens and the earth, the seas and all they contain, who preserves fidelity forever, who does justice to those who are oppressed.

It is he who gives bread to the hungry, the LORD who sets prisoners free,

the LORD who opens the eyes of the blind, the LORD who raises up those who are bowed down.

It is the LORD who loves the just, the LORD who protects the stranger and upholds the orphan and the widow, but thwarts the path of the wicked.

LECTIO DIVINA: MATTHEW 9:9-13

As Jesus was walking on he saw a man named Matthew sitting by the customs house, and he said to him, 'Follow me.' And he got up and followed him.

While he was at dinner in the house, it happened that a number of tax collectors and sinners came to sit at the table with Jesus and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, 'Why does your master eat with tax collectors and sinners?' When he heard this, he replied, 'It is not healthy who need the doctor, but the sick. Go and learn the meaning of the words: What I want is mercy, not sacrifice. And indeed, I did not come to call the virtuous, but sinners.'

REFLECTION: FROM A SERMON OF SAINT BEDE THE VENERABLE

Jesus saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax office, and he said to him: Follow me. Jesus saw

Matthew, not merely in the usual sense, but more significantly with his merciful understanding of men.

He saw the tax collector, and because he saw him through the eyes of mercy and chose him, he said to him: *Follow me*. This following meant imitating the pattern of his life – not just walking after him. St John tells us: *Whoever says he abides in Christ ought to walk in the same way in which he walked*.

And he rose and followed him. There is no reason for surprise that the tax collector abandoned earthly wealth as soon as the Lord commanded him. Nor should one be amazed that neglecting his wealth, he joined a band of men whose leader had, on Matthew's assessment, no riches at all. Our Lord summoned Matthew by speaking to him in words. By an invisible, interior impulse flooding his mind with the light of grace, he instructed him to walk in his footsteps. In this way, Matthew could understand that Christ, who was summoning him away from earthly possessions, had incorruptible treasures of heaven in his gift.

RESPONSE

Be attached only to Jesus Christ, his doctrine, and his holy maxims, because he has done you the honour of choosing you in preference to a great many others to announce truth to the young, whom he loves so especially. Think highly of your work, which is apostolic, and carefully study the Gospel of Saint Matthew, in which we find proposed the holiest maxims of Jesus Christ and the fundamental truths of Christian piety. The more you study this, the more learned you would become in the science of the saints, and the better prepared you will be to instruct others

Commentary: This psalm shows that God is interested not only in the national community but also in the individual pious person who makes time to get to know God intimately by dwelling and abiding in God's all-embracing presence. The person on such terms with the Lord has no fear in asking the help of the One who has provided freedom and security throughout life. It is a wonderful expression of Faith in the goodness of a loving God. The love of God is certain during the crises of sickness and ill health that befall even a good person, and so suddenly through causes unknown. For us, following the Founder's model of being angels sent by God for the liberation of poor youth, we are commanded to be vigilant and keep those confided to our care along smooth pathways bearing them up should they stumble along the way. It is a prayer to see the miracles of God's love in every day.

He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High, and abides in the shade of the Almighty, says to the LORD, "My refuge, my stronghold, my God in whom I trust!"

He will free you from the snare of the fowler, from the destructive plague; he will conceal you with his pinions, and under his wings, you will find refuge. His faithfulness is buckler and shield.

You will not fear the terror of the night, nor the arrow that flies by day, nor the plague that prowls in the darkness, nor the scourge that lays waste at noon.

A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand falls at your right: you it will never approach.

RESPONSE: BROTHER SUPERIOR'S PASTORAL LETTER 25TH DECEMBER 2016

Today, the Spirit's "one call" to us Brothers who live in fraternal association for the purpose of responding joyfully, creatively and courageously to the human and Christian educational desires of poor, vulnerable and excluded young people is comparable to the foundational invitation:

"Deeply moved by the human and spiritual distress 'of the children of artisans and the poor,' and in response to the call of God, John Baptist de La Salle and his first Brothers made a lifelong commitment to God to provide these children with a human and Christian education, and so extend the glory of God on earth."

LECTIO: THE DELIGHTFUL AND COMFORTING JOY OF EVANGELIZING.

The Gospel offers us the chance to live life on a higher plane, but with no less intensity: "Life grows by being given away, and it weakens in isolation and comfort. Indeed, those who enjoy life most are those who leave security on the shore and become excited by the mission of communicating life to others".

When the Church summons Christians to take up the task of evangelisation, she Is simply pointing to the source of authentic personal fulfilment. For "here we discover a profound law of reality: that life is attained and matures in the measure that it is offered up in order to give life to others. This is certainly what mission means". Consequently, an evangelizer must never look like someone who has just come back from a funeral! Let us recover and deepen our enthusiasm, that "delightful and comforting joy of evangelising, even when it is in tears that we must sow... And may the world of our time, which is searching, sometimes with anguish, sometimes with hope, be enabled to receive the good news not

from evangelizers who are dejected, discouraged, impatient or anxious, but from ministers of the Gospel whose lives glow with fervor, who have first received the joy of Christ".
