In 2016 the Broome Chamber entered into a first-ever agreement of its kind with the Department of Training and Workforce Development.

Working Together is a partnership with the Broome Aboriginal Workforce Development Centre to increase business employment of Aboriginal youth.

Supported by the Shire of Broome and the Kimberley Development Commission, Cruise Broome is a niche committee of stakeholders comprised of the Chamber, Port, Tourism Leadership Group and private enterprise. It has recently employed a Tour Coordinator to create new experiences for sale on ships, which will meet the industry's appetite for bespoke cruise passenger tours, and build an ongoing revenue stream for the group. Cruise Broome has already made a considerable impact on industry, attracting 17 ships to Broome Port in 2017 and the promise of even larger things to come.





CHINATOWN REVITALISATION

In partnership with RFF Australia, the Broome Chamber of Commerce and Industry has been selected as the communications and community engagement consultant, and will develop and implement the communications plan for the overall project, as well as undertake community engagement for the three feasibility projects. This work will be undertaken under the name Ignite Chinatown, providing a common focus for activities.
