Re: *Notice to the Profession Re- Brampton Civil Motions Lists – Unopposed and Ex Parte Motions*

It has recently been noted that there has been a significant increase in unopposed civil motions appearing on the Brampton motions list.

Many of these motions are what would ordinarily be considered as basket motions.

These unopposed and non-urgent ex parte motions must not be filed for inclusion on the civil motions lists as they unnecessarily add to the judicial and administrative time involved in dealing with these motions.

Any such motion may, in the discretion of the presiding judge or Master, simply be referred back to the trial office to be considered as a basket motion.

If an unopposed or ex parte motion is urgent, counsel may request that the court staff flag the motion as such and it will be brought to the attention of a judge.

Counsel are urged to carefully consider the nature of the motion before it is submitted for inclusion on a regular motion list.
