Good day friends and families of Community Living Burlington.

I hope that you all enjoyed the first warm, long weekend of 2021. However, I know that it would have been better if you had the opportunity to see your loved ones.

As we move to June 2nd and hopefully the end of the Stay-at-Home order, we have decided to allow the return of outside visits at the homes of your family member starting today.

These visits must be organized with the manager of the program with the following precautions in place:

- You must pass an active screening for COVID-19 at the house.
- You must wear surgical/procedure masks and eye protection at all times.
- You must maintain physical distance at all times (2 meters/6 feet).
- You must not enter the home during visits.
- Visits must be supervised by support staff.

We ask that you respect the parameters of the visits at all times; which we know can be difficult to do.

As much as we are thrilled to see the reduction of COVID-19 positive cases in Ontario, we, unfortunately, are still having outbreaks at our homes. If the home of your loved one is affected, the visit will have to be postponed until the outbreak is declared over by the Halton Health Department.

There is a light at the end of the tunnel and with the anticipated 2nd dose of vaccines for the people we support no later than the end of July, we are hoping that by September we will have some sort of normal life at CLB.

Please speak with your manager to arrange your visits and I wish you all a safe spring.
