HIGHLIGHTS

Dear Families and Friends of St Augustine's Parish School.

Welcome to Term 3 and a very special welcome to our new Reception children and their families. The children have settled in well and they are enjoying their first school experience.

The school has also resumed **Playgroup** and **Occasional Care** and families are reminded that bookings are essential and, as always, if your child is sick, please do not come to school, to Playgroup or to Occasional Care.

Many families have asked when parents will be allowed back on site. At this point in time, given the experience in Victoria, we will be continuing to have parents **drop children at the gate** and pick them up at the gate in the afternoon. For the foreseeable future, only Reception parents will be allowed on site. Whilst this may be inconvenient to some, this is all about making sure that we keep ourselves as safe as possible at this time.

The school continues to provide children with **hand sanitiser and soap** and there are two hand sanitiser stations at the entrance gates to the school. Mr Mardy disinfects the school each day and cleaners clean the school everyday, especially the toilets, drink fountains and tables. Parents are asked to use the hand sanitiser in the **Front Office** and to observe physical distancing at all times. Please feel free to call the school if you need anything that we can provide rather than coming in to the office, this may include school uniforms, canteen orders, queries about the school diary.

Sunshine Café is open for business and children who need a second breakfast or didn't get up in time to have the first one, can access a nutritious first meal of the day. Hopefully we will soon be open to whole families for breakfast.

Learning Conversations are in **Week 3** and parents are very welcome on site for those meetings, keeping physically distanced and rescheduling if you are unwell. During these meetings teachers will explain a survey that Catholic Education SA is undertaking surrounding students with particular learning needs. We ask that parents avail themselves of this survey which is online and a link has been sent to families via Dojo and SeeSaw. We thank you in anticipation for your input.

Families are reminded that school concludes at 3.15 pm. Our Front Office is being inundated with families wanting to pick up children from 2.30 pm onwards, every single day! This has a huge impact on children's learning time and the teachers' abilities to focus entirely on the children in the class. The Front Office staff are being asked to ring through to classrooms as late as 3.10 pm for an early pick up. This cannot continue and we ask that parents only request an early pick up for doctor's or dentist's appointments. The Front Office is not a pick up point for children. From now on, parents wanting to collect children from 3.00 pm will be asked to meet their children at the gate on Carey Street or the Church Car Park. If you have a professional appointment for your child, please let the Front Office and the teacher know first thing in the morning so that arrangements can be made that do not disrupt learning at the end of the day. We thank you for your co-operation with this very important matter. Parents are reminded that after school parking is in the Church or Chapel Car Parks and not across the road in the car parks of other businesses on Commercial Road.

Thank you to all of the parents who park in the church and chapel car park each afternoon to collect their children from school. Kerri Dent and Georgia Dennis have new careers of 'Lollipop Ladies' and traffic managers in the car parks and the cooperation of families is greatly appreciated. We do remind families that parking on the corner of Kelly and Carey Streets is very dangerous as cars come around the corner and cannot always see a car that is parked on the yellow line. We have had a couple of near misses in the last week. We ask all families to observe the road rules and parking restrictions and to exercise just a little bit of patience as we endeavour to move everybody safely out of the school grounds and immediate area.

Some of our annual events such as **Wakakirri** and **Catholic Schools Music Festival** will look very different this year with performances being recorded and not open to the public. This is a sad consequence of the state that we find ourselves in with Covid19. The upside is that the children will still have an opportunity to have the 'stage' experience which will be on video.
