School Crossing

Families may have noticed the new Emu Crossing on Carey Street. The crossing came about through our work with Way to Go Bike Ed and together we were successful in receiving a crossing for our children and their families. Please use the new crossing if you are crossing Carey Street.



Parking

Other changes to access and egress to the school include the boom gate on the staff car park. Throughout last year we implored families to use the safer Church and Chapel carparks for dropping off and picking up children and most of our families complied with our requests. However there were a growing number of families who continued to use the staff car park in the mornings and afternoons putting children at risk and damaging staff cars. We have installed a boom gate which will only allow staff to use the car park and for families to avail themselves of the much safer car parks around the Church and the Chapel.

New classrooms

On the eastern side of the school the little Year 1 village has been completed. The children have enjoyed having their own ramp and covered deck for play and work. Children in the MacKillop Building have new carpet as do the children in the Canossian Building and the interior of many classrooms received a fresh coat of paint over the Christmas break.

Occasional Care

We now have Occasional Care! Every Wednesday, Carole Smith and her team are running Occasional Care from the Pre-School Room opposite the Admin building in Siena Hall. Please see Carole if you wish to enrol your child to attend on a Wednesday from $9.00 \, \text{am} - 11.30 \, \text{am}$. There is a cost of \$10.00 per session for a casual booking, \$80.00 for nine weeks. We encourage Little Augustine's transitioning students to utilise this service prior to beginning their transition visits.

Playgroup will now also operate out of the Pre-School Room on Monday, Tuesday and Friday. Come along and enjoy this beautiful learning experience with your child and other parents.

Thank you to those parents who came to the Meet the Teacher on Wednesday evening. Making it a priority in getting to know your child's teacher or teachers strengthens the partnership between home and school and has a positive impact on each child's learning.

Nude Food days

One of our foci for 2020 is the reduction of plastics and waste in the school. We are encouraging all children to take advantage of the chilled, filtered water at water stations around the school when they need to refill water bottles and to engage in our whole school Nude Food days on Tuesday and Thursday. Nude food days are when food brought from home is not wrapped in plastic but placed in a resealable and reusable container or lunch box. Packaged food is not Nude Food. We encourage children to bring food from home on these days. This initiative is in response to a drive across schools to act locally to replace plastic and reduce waste which goes to landfill. Our children are very environmentally conscious and they are keen to embrace this new way of being and caring for our planet.

Grow Up Smiling Dental

This week the Dental Service began working in our school. This is a free service and a great way to have your child's teeth checked. If there is a need to carry out any dental work this can be organised through this service. We are very grateful to the Dental Service and Grow Up Smiling who provide this important high quality health service to the children of St Augustine's Parish School.

New staff

Michelle Robinson from Talking Matters is working in the school for two days per week to support teachers with children who have speech needs. Michelle's games and activities help all children to speak clearly and to therefore learn their letter sounds, communicate more effectively, increase their vocabulary and understanding of language as well as reading.

Community Hub

English classes have recommenced in the Community Hub and we welcome our new adult English teacher Yonna Pettigrew who will be working with families every Tuesday and Wednesday in Term 1. Creche will be offered to families participating in the English Program.

Performing Arts News

Welcome to 2020 at St Augustine's for an exciting year of learning!

For those who don't know me, my name is Paula Giugliano. This is my fourth year teaching Performing Arts in this wonderful school community. Each class in the school attends a 45 minute Performing Arts lesson where they experience and participate in a different focus area each term.

Following is a brief overview of what students will take part in throughout this year:

Term 1 – Dance Focus (R-2 Move & Groove, Years 3-6 Hip Hop Hooray/Culture & Dance) - All classes will perform a whole school dance for the opening of Sports Day.

Term 2 – Music Focus (R-2 Percussion & Elements of Music, Year 3 Recorder, Years 4-6 Ukulele)

Term 3 – Drama Focus (Mime, Improvisation, Characterisation and Script Work)

Wakakirri Performance at the Adelaide Entertainment Centre. Wakakirri is Australia's largest Performing Arts Event for Schools. Year 4-6 students will be invited to audition in Week 3 Term 1 and rehearsals will be at school on Fridays.

Term 4 – Singing & Performance Focus (linked to our school End of Year Concert in which all classes will perform)

Aboriginal Cultural Residency Program at St Augustine's

This term, as part of Performing Arts lessons, some classes will have the opportunity to work with an Aboriginal Dancer as part of a Catholic Education Program.

The Aboriginal Cultural Residency Program is an opportunity for school communities to engage a resident artist with lived experience as an Aboriginal Australian who has expertise in Art and Culture. The residency is a focus on the expertise of the artist as well as their experiences as an Aboriginal Australian. It is a co-constructed collaboration between the teacher, the resident and the students. This program is intended for non-indigenous students as well as Aboriginal students.

Kaine Sultan Babij will work with classes on Thursday mornings. He is a contemporary Aboriginal Dancer. Kaine is of Eastern Arrernte, Afghan and Croatian heritage. He was born and raised in Whyalla, South Australia. The pursuit of artistic growth lead Kaine to the National Aboriginal and Islander Skills Development Association (NAISDA) in Sydney, and the Aboriginal Centre for the Performing Arts (ACPA) in Brisbane. Kaine has since toured extensively throughout Australia, North and South America, Asia and Europe, showcasing Australian Indigenous and contemporary dance. Kaine returned to South Australia from Sydney in 2019 after spending 10 years working with Bangarra Dance Company. Kaine worked in 18 Catholic schools in 2019 as a part of the program, including Holy Family, St Patrick's, CBC Junior, St Joseph's Hectorville, St Francis of Assisi, Stella Maris, Christ the King, Kildare, Sacred Heart, Nazareth, St Ignatius and Galilee.

We look forward to welcoming Kaine to our school community in Week 3.

The school card eligibility limit has increased to gross income limit of \$60,264 for one child, increasing by \$1,076 for each subsequent child.



This term we are very excited to be able to offer families an Occasional Care Service which is located on site in the Pre-School room at St Augustine's.

OCCASIONAL CARE: provides an early childhood educational program for children aged 3-5 years. This service is regulated and approved by the Education & Care Standards Board. The service aims to provide a playful learning program focusing and building upon a child's sense of inquiry and wonder.

Sessions are from 9.00am-11.30am, enrolment and bookings are essential, cost \$10.00 per session, there are also options to book for a term.
