Continuing Enrolment 2020

Survey

In a world of data, we are seeking information from our school community with regard to parent satisfaction and perceptions of the safety and care given to children and their families at St Augustine's Parish School. We will be sending out a Survey Monkey in the next week and we invite as many families as possible to complete this valuable exercise. The information that we gain from your responses will help us to continue to do the things that work well and address places where we can do better.

Loose Parts Program

You may have noticed if your children attend OSHC that the new Loose Parts Program is running well, with children highly engaged in collaborative play and problem solving, using natural materials, junk and materials that can be moved, carried, combined, redesigned, lined up and taken apart and put back together in multiple ways. They are materials with no specific set of directions that can be used alone or combined with other materials. This type of play encourages testing, problem solving, collaboration and celebration of children's 'work', that is, PLAY. This play is messy and does not fit polite aesthetics but it is play that draws children from many groups together to really play in partnership with rich oral language discussions and sophisticated ideas. You may like to try this at home with your own children but be prepared that children will play with sticks, they will be highly engaged, they will increase their problem solving strategy and their gross motor competence. They will not be bored and this type of play does not cost a lot of money.

Kiribati Donations

On Fridays you will see staff at St Augustine's dressed in 'active wear'. Teachers agreed to trial a special way of supporting our friends on the islands of Kiribati. St Augustine's Parish School supports our Kiribati sister school for visually and hearing impaired children. Teachers donate a gold coin to wear active wear (some actually are donating to NOT wear active wear) to raise money for the people of Kiribati. This community knows what they need to help them battle the effects of climate change on their coral atoll and the money we raise will go towards enabling them to deal with this constant and growing issue for their community and especially their children. TERM 4 SCHOOL FEES

School Fee Statements were posted home last week and if you have any queries please contact me to discuss. As we are nearing the end of another year, all school fees should be paid in full by 25 October 2019 (unless you have a payment plan in place that is sufficient to cover the fees by the end of the year or if alternative arrangements have been made). If you are having difficulties in meeting the deadline of 25 October, please contact the Finance Office to make an agreement/ payment arrangement.

All overdue school fees will be charged a \$50 overdue fee for every term they fall overdue. This includes Direct Debit, Centrepay deductions, BPays and Direct Credits that will not cover all of this year's fees by the end of the year. If you need to check your calculation to ensure that your fees are paid in full, please contact me either in person or email me. SIBLING ENROLMENTS - ENROLLING NOW FOR 2020 AND 2021

Parents of students already attending St Augustine's who also have children nearing school age still need to complete an Enrolment Form – please contact the Front Office if you require a Reception place in 2020. We are currently enrolling children for Term 1 intake (turning 5 before 30th April) and Term 3 intake (turning 5 before 31st October). If your child turns 5 after 31st October, they will commence school in Term 1 of the following year.

SCHOOL CARD

If you have already applied for School Card this year and have received a letter from the School Card Department stating that you are ineligible, please come and see me to apply for a re-assessment. This needs to be done prior to the next submission date, 25 October 2019 (Friday Week 2 Term 4). Also, if you have not already applied THIS YEAR, and believe that you meet the criteria to receive this discount, please do so immediately to avoid paying higher fees.

The committee reserves the right to reject stories where they feel they are less than appropriate to the spirit of the exercise. However we don't envisage having to action this right.
