HIGHLIGHTS

Children's University

On Monday 5 November children from Years 3 to 7 and their proud families attended the Children's University Graduation Ceremony at Bonython Hall.

130 children from St Augustine's Parish School graduated with awards. Caitlin H received a National Bronze Degree for 330 hours extra curricular work. Christopher D received the National Gold Diploma for 300 hours, Jacinta P received the National Silver Diploma for 265 hours, Daniella E received the National Bronze Diploma for 230 hours. Four children received the National Gold Certificate for 200 hours and four children received the National Silver Certificate for 165 hours. 10 children received the National Bronze Certificate for 130 hours and 9 children received the National Gold Award for 100 hours. The remainder of the children received their National Bronze and Silver Awards for 30 and 65 hours of work respectively.

Congratulations to all the children from St Augustine's Parish School for their participation in the Children's University Learning Activities. It was an honour for Georgia as the Principal to read out so many names and congratulate children, teachers and their families for this exemplary effort.

A special thank you must go to Simone Dajeman who has co-ordinated the Children's University this year. We thank Simone for her tireless work and high level of organisation in achieving such success for our children and the school.

2018 SCHOOL FEES OVERDUE

All overdue school fees will be charged a \$50 overdue fee. This includes Direct Debit, Centrepay deductions, BPays and Direct Credits that will not repay this year's fees by the end of the year. If you need to check your calculation to ensure that your fees are paid in full, please contact me either in person or by email.

SIBLING ENROLMENTS

Parents of students already attending St Augustine's who also have children nearing school age still need to complete an Enrolment Form – please contact the Front Office immediately if you require a Reception place in 2019. We are currently enrolling children for Term 1 intake (turning 5 before 30th April) and Term 3 intake (turning 5 before 31st October). If your child turns 5 after 31st October, they will commence school in Term 1 of the following year.


SCHOOL CARD - LAST CHANCE FOR 2018
