Parking

Our School is very fortunate to have generous car parking available to the School community during drop off and pick up times. This includes the Chapel and Church Car Parks and Street parking along Commercial Road, Carey Street and other side streets behind Carey Street, including a morning kiss and drop zone along the Church car park drive way.

The staff car park is for staff only and the front car park is for pick up and drop off from 9.15am to 2.30pm. Unfortunately, a small number of community members are utilising these car parks and doing so in an unsafe manner. For safety reasons the front car park will now be locked at 8.30am and unlocked approximately 9.15am. The staff car park will be made inaccessible to those people who are not staff.

If you have a disability permit you can utilise a disability park next to the Church gate in the Church car park. This and the other three school gates are supervised by a staff member. Students can wait with this staff member until 3.30pm, when the gate is locked and any uncollected students brought to the front office.

We would like to thank those people who currently do the right thing to help keep all students safe.
