CoP observations thus far...


- Cost vs Risk

Group observations thus far...

- Benefits of Standardised Asset Management in Defence
 - Remove silos
 - Horizontally through process standardisation
 - Vertically through reporting standardisation
 - Better functional integration – common goals
 - Improved reliability and maintainability
 - Better use of existing risk tools
- Proposed Asset Management WBS aligns with nine elements of FIC:
 - *Organisation, Command & Management, Personnel, Collective Training, Major Systems, Facilities & Training Areas, Supply, Support, Industry.*
