Direct Debit health check

If you have a direct debit in place please ensure that:

- It is of a sufficient amount to cover your fees in full by the end of the year – if an amendment needs to be made this can be communicated by email using the address below.
- You have sufficient funds to cover the amount on the scheduled date. If you see a number of rejections on your account, there will probably be a note once again please contact me if you need to amend your details.

<u>Do you think you may qualify for the Lower Income Fee</u> (Previously School Card)?

If you think your income falls within these limits please remember to apply for School Card if you haven't already done so. School Card must be applied for each year. School Card is assessed on the previous year's income, so if you had a drop in income last year due to COVID you may qualify. Please remember that your school card application cannot be assessed if you have not lodged your previous year's tax return.

School Card applications can be made online or by completing the application form which is available on our website or from the Front Office.

Parking Reminder for Kiss and Drop Zones in Car Parks


PARKING IN THE GREENWITH CAMPUS CARPARK

(AT THE FRONT OF THE SCHOOL)

We would like to remind all parents and caregivers of the **importance of following the correct procedures when driving around the Greenwith Campus area**. When construction is complete at Greenwith Primary School we ask that when using Labernum Drive Kiss and Drop you adhere to the conditions. Parking, double parking and leaving your vehicle are <u>NOT PERMITTED</u>. It is imperative that you drive within the speed limit when children are present.

To ensure the safety of children and families who use the car park and to reduce the chance of an accident, Campus Management asks that all families who use the car park in front of the Parish Centre drive in through the second entrance and out through the entrance closest to the street. Do not turn right to join the queue again but exit the car park, drive around the roundabout and back into the car park. DO NOT QUEUE ACROSS THE ROUNDABOUT. TO HELP WITH THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC DO NOT EXIT YOUR CAR TO ASSIST CHILDREN WITH CAR SEATS OR SCHOOL BAGS. If your child requires assistance, please park your car in the car park and walk into the school grounds as it holds up the flow of traffic not only on the school grounds but for road users on Golden Grove Road and The Golden Way (i.e. Emergency Services vehicles, buses, cars etc.) banking up around the roundabout causing traffic to come to a standstill.

Below is a diagram which shows the flow of traffic that is involved in this. If there are any questions or queries about this please feel free to approach the office staff of either school.





Parking Reminder for Kiss and Drop Zones in Car Parks

PARKING IN THE COMMUNITY CENTRE CARPARK

(AT THE REAR OF THE SCHOOL)


If you use the Kiss & Ride pick up zone in front of the Community Centre when collecting your child/children after school, you are reminded that if your child/children haven't arrived and aren't waiting for you when you get there, <u>YOU ARE NOT ALLOWED TO</u> PARK IN THE PICKUP ZONE AND WAIT FOR THEM. <u>DO NOT WAIT IN THE QUEUE WELL BEFORE PICK UP TIME, PLEASE</u> PARK IN THE SPACES PROVIDED. If your child/children are not there waiting for you when you arrive, you are required to drive around the car park and come back again making your way to the end of the Kiss & Ride pick up lane (near the playground). This procedure needs to be repeated until your child/children arrive. <u>UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES ARE YOU PERMITTED TO LEAVE</u> YOUR VEHICLE UNATTENDED IN THIS ZONE. Please ensure if you are not the one collecting your child/children that the person/s collecting them are aware of the correct procedure.

Stopping on a continuous yellow edge line is illegal under the Australian Road Rules, Road Traffic Act 1961 (see exert below) and incurs an expiation fee of \$164.

"169—No stopping on a road with a yellow edge line

A driver must not stop at the side of a road marked with a continuous yellow edge line.

Speed limits in South Australia

25 km/h • between the signs at a chi flashing

- between the signs at a children's crossing when the alternating lights are flashing
- when passing, in either direction, a school bus that has apparently stopped to pick up or set down passengers
 - on a portion of road within a School Zone when a child is present
 - (or as indicated) when passing road works with signs displayed.
