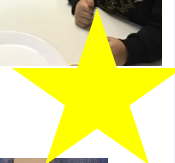

Dear Parents

It is hard to believe that we are into our final term of the 2021 School year. Due to the disruptions in Admin staffing towards the end of last term, our final newsletter for Term 3 was not finalised and sent out to parents. So this newsletter contains a celebration of the events from Term 3 and also some information as we prepare for 2022.

### Term 3 School Events & Parents and Friends:

Last term we celebrated a number of school events which were greatly enjoyed by our students and staff. Some of these events included Book week, School Disco, Our Lady of Hope Day and the Parents and Friends Committee also ran a Father's Day stall.

I would like to say a **BIG THANK YOU** to all of the members of our **Parents and Friends Committee**. Last term we had a number of parents who very generously donated their time and skills to support with the Father's Day Stall and who organised and supported with the supervision and running of the school disco.

Both of these events benefit our children and it is the support of parents that make events like these possible and which support our strong sense of community. It is great to see a number of new parents joining our P&F group. If you are interested in being involved in the Parents and Friends Committee, even if you can only support with one or two events per year, please don't hesitate to contact Donna Eeles at the school so she can add you to our list.

The P&F can be a good way to meet new people and form social connections with others at the school.

### Permanent staffing appointments

Late last term, we interviewed and appointed 4 permanent teaching positions at Our Lady of Hope school. Our school has not appointed any permanent teaching positions since 2010. During that time we have had a number of fantastic teachers join our community on year to year contracts. As a result of the interview process I am delighted to inform the community that Tania Willsdon, Joanne Tonkin, Jenny Mittiga and Renee Leleu have been appointed to permanent teaching positions at Our Lady of Hope. All four of these teachers have been on contract at Our Lady of Hope and it is great to be able to reward their hard work and commitment to Our Lady of Hope School with permanency and secure their skills and expertise.

### News about classes for 2022

I am pleased to inform the community that as a result of an increase in demand for Reception places in 2022, we will be adding an additional class from the beginning on next year.

We will have 3 Reception classes in 2022 and we will also be running a stand alone Mid-year Reception class which will commence at the beginning of Term 3. The separate mid – year class has provided many benefits for the children this year and has enabled us to offer a hybrid program with a great balance of explicit learning tasks in literacy and numeracy and play based learning opportunities. The stand alone mid-year Reception class is something we are keen to pursue into the future.

The introduction of a new Reception class will mean that there will be about 17- 18 children in each class which is a nice size to give our children a great start to their schooling life.

This also means that we have some extra spaces for any new Reception children wishing to commence in Term One next year.

If you know of anyone who is considering a last minute enrolment at Our Lady of Hope in 2022, then please encourage them to contact the front office as we have about 6 vacancies available in Reception.

### Other Staffing News

In other staffing news, I am pleased to announce that Ashlee Lucas and her husband Michael are expecting their second baby on the 19<sup>th</sup> of December. Ashlee has been teaching 2 days per week in our Mid-Year Reception class in Room 5 and will be finished on Friday the 5<sup>th</sup> of November.

Sarah Walsh who currently teaches in the Room 5 for three days per week has kindly agreed to teach full time for the remainder of the 2022 school year. We wish Ashlee and Michael all the best and pray for the safe delivery of a healthy baby.

I can also inform the community that Megan Pratt has been successful in securing a permanent teaching position at St John the Baptist, Catholic School at Plympton. Megan has been a permanent teacher at Our Lady of Hope for nearly 20 years and took leave this year to pursue a teaching contract which is much closer to her home.

## From the Principal

I would like to thank Megan for her dedication and service towards the Our Lady of Hope community over a number of years and wish her well with her new position.

### Year 4 Camp

In the first week of this term I was fortunate to be able to attend the Year 4 camp at Narnu Farm.

This was a wonderful experience and I loved spending time with this wonderful group of children as they embarked on their first school camp. School camps provide a great opportunity for children to get to know each other better, practice some independent living skills and try some new activities.

The way in which the children cooperated and worked together made the camp a wonderful experience. I would like to thank our staff Christine Goodwin, Suzie Subotkiewicz, Trish Harding, Renee Leleu and Pauline Lensink for their attendance on camp.

### Child Protection Week – 5 to 11 September

Last term we recognised Child Protection Week. The theme for this week was "Every child in every community needs a fair go." Child protection is clearly a very important aspect of the life of schools and it is all of our responsibility to work together to do all we can to make sure our children are safe and get a fair go.

As a school we take child protection very seriously and our aim is to work in partnership with parents to

ensure that all of our children are kept free from harm.

All staff and volunteers in our schools are required by law to be mandated notifiers and ensure that they take steps to ensure the safety of children when they suspect a child or young person may be at risk of harm or abuse.

As part of our approach to educating children about ways to recognise danger and keep themselves safe, all children are taught the Keeping Safe – Child Protection Curriculum.

The explosion of social media over the last decade has meant that people are now accessible 24/7. Social media can provide many benefits for children and provide them with another medium through which they can communicate with their friends and loved ones.

However with these benefits also comes increased risk to children as there is the potential for children to come into contact with people who may use this medium of communication to exploit or harm them. As adults we need to be aware of what our children are doing on line and more importantly who they are interacting with.

The Department of Education and Children's services have released a Cyber Safety policy, which governs how we as schools deal with Cyber Safety issues. I have provided a link to this information below.

At Our Lady of Hope we have very strict guidelines in place in order to ensure our children are kept safe from harm. All of our volunteers and people who work with children need to undergo police checks and screening.

Our staff and volunteers are guided by a set of behaviour guidelines which they must comply with when working with children.

All children deserve to have a fair go and protecting children from harm and inappropriate content both in person and online is the collective responsibility of all the adults who are involved in a child's life.

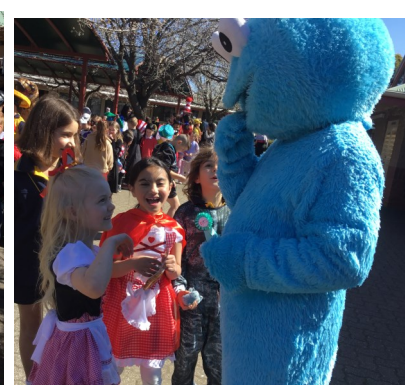
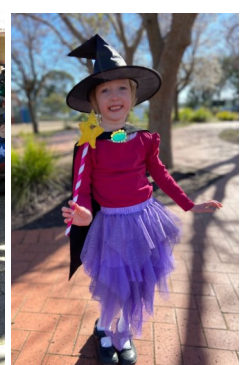

## Cans for Kids Project

The Cans For Kids Project is a school recycling project that generates funding to help disadvantaged kids go to school. The project is based in Indonesia and Ghana.

Students at OLOH School collect, clean and sort recyclables which are sold to raise money. Other schools including Burnside, Keithcot Farm and Greenwith PS have also contributed.

In Indonesia the money raised has established:

- \* a free range pig farm in Songan Village, Bali.
- \* a micro finance goat project in Nusa Penida.
- \* sponsorship of 5 children and their siblings in Karangasem region.
- \* support of families with the evacuation program during volcano eruptions.



In Ghana more recently:

- Donations of educational materials, sporting goods, art supplies, toys and clothing were donated to Ghana in shipping containers.
- Construction of a school has begun in east Ghana, which is the latest ongoing project. Land has been purchased, a security building constructed, a polytank established to harvest water, coconut boundary trees planted and a boundary fence constructed.
- This year we are aiming to build a toilet block.



OLOH School won a humanitarian award from the Minister for Education and Child Development, for our efforts helping underprivileged kids go to school.



In addition, Morgan Broadbent ((Right) Senior CFKP Ambassador) won the Fred Hollows humanitarian award for her contribution to the CFKP, which included a \$10k donation to Kenya, to restore eyesight. Morgan is now at Gleeson College, continuing recycling for CFKP.



Patrick Coghill ((Left) Year 6 OLOH School) has been an regular recycling contributor since he started school at a mere 5 years old. His sense of social justice has continued to grow and he has been appointed Junior CFKP Ambassador.

Covid has put the brakes on our recycling efforts but as they say, "it's not over till it's over."

CFKP was accepted by the Community Bank to partake in its Community Lottery this year, giving us a good start to our "Dunny Money Project" and we are hopeful that we might be able to organise another fundraiser next term.

Please remember that your school card application cannot be assessed if you have not lodged your previous year's tax return.
