Dianne's story of deciding to potentially sacrifice her rich and fulfilling life here on Earth for the unknowns of space travel is one of adventure, resilience, mental and physical strength, sustainability, and continual curiosity and learning. After





enjoying Dianne's presentation and asking her some excellent questions, students took the opportunity to meet Dianne in person, take some selfies, and try some roasted crickets and cricket-based protein bars (a very sustainable protein choice both on Earth and in space).

After recess the Year 9 form teams prepared debate arguments for numerous ethical and moral questions related to a Mars mission. Teachers noted how wonderful it was to be able to witness high levels of engagement in the ethical thinking challenge and enjoyed assisting students with building strong cases for their position.

Our 2019 Year 9 students approached their first *M2M* challenge with energy and enthusiasm, demonstrating their willingness to stretch their thinking in new ways and to work collaboratively. We encourage students and parents alike to discuss the premise of our 'mission' – what would a successful colony on Mars look like? The *Mission to Mars* Team is very excited to hear the ideas that the students come up with and are looking forward to our next challenge, which is focused on creative and critical thinking, novel problem-solving, teamwork, and some robotic helpers – stay tuned!

Learning Resource Centre (LRC) Digital & Information Literacy Program 2019

Learning for the 21st Century involves developing skills in Information Literacy and ICT Literacy. This month each Year 9 form participated in the LRC's Digital and Information Literacy program for a full day, which forms part of the transition program into Mac.Rob and provides a comprehensive introduction to the learning resources held in the LRC.

Students took part in a number of workshops aimed to develop their understanding and skills in Information and IT Literacy, higher order thinking and team approach to problem solving. Some of the skills include accessing and evaluating a range of information from both traditional and online resources, organising and synthesising selected information, and considering how to most effectively communicate and present the knowledge in a diverse and multimedia environment.


The skills obtained during these sessions can be utilised across the students' time at Mac.Rob and will assist them to become independent learners and researchers into the future.

- 2 vacancies at 1 year


Ballot papers are available on Compass, and each parent/guardian has one vote. If you are unable to obtain one please contact the school on 9864 7700.
