Principal's Report

ADJUSTING TO THE FIRST WEEKS OF SCHOOL

Back to school can be a very emotional time for children. For first-time students, being away from parents, adjusting to a new environment with new people, and adapting to a new routine can be overwhelming. You can help by talking about the positive aspects of school. Tell stories about your happy, funny and enjoyable experiences at school. Talk to older siblings about ways they can help so they don't tell scary stories.

- Establish regular bedtime and wake-up routines. Children, including teenagers, need plenty of sleep. They may be more tired than usual and need time to relax. You may find that rather than becoming more grown up, young children might regress or become more difficult or defiant, in response to the stress of the new routines.
- Celebrate the start of school with a special meal or outing. Make the experience as happy and positive as you can.
- Children normally shed a few tears when they part from their parents. Try not to extend your stay because it can prolong and intensify the child's reaction. This behavior may last a few days or weeks. Teachers are prepared to handle the situation and if alerted that a child may react to separation, they can give the student a special job or a partner in the class to help with the adjustment period. Even if children have been to school previously, they might still find their initial weeks a period of change.

I would like to thank the many people who have made me feel welcome at St Thomas More School community. I have already met with the students and am looking forward to meeting families. I certainly have a great sense of excitement and optimism this year and beyond.

Staff and I have had lots of meetings and it is because of their passion and enthusiasm that the planning for 2019 should be smooth.

There is much to celebrate and to recognise the rich heritage of our past, the gifts of the present and the vision for the future. It is a great privilege to be Principal of St Thomas More School and I look forward to being part of this community. I encourage you to be an active member in our community and take up every opportunity possible to be involved in your child's education.

School fees and school card

Fees

A reminder that School Fees are billed at the beginning of the year and payable over the first three terms, unless payment is organised by instalments over the school year. (This can be done through the school office).

Many families choose a direct debit from their chosen account or Centrepay to be able to pay the school fees over the course of the year.

School Card Scheme

The School Card Scheme administered by the Department of Education and Children's Services is a scheme to provide assistance for low-income families towards the cost of school books, stationery and other basic school requisites. Families are required to apply for School Card discount at the beginning of each school year.

This decision is made by the Government, independent of St Thomas More School.
