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
At Antonio we love Gymanastics!

At Antonio we celebrate Mary Help of Christians Day.

Mary is;

- 1. The Mother of Jesus
- 2. The Patron Saint of Australia AND
- 3. Our church at Morphett Vale is Mary Help of Christians Church.

For all these reasons we celebrate Mary's special saints' day which usually falls on 24th May.

We will work in teams in the gym to make a decade of the Rosary. We will celebrate a short liturgy and pray with our Rosary beads. We will conclude our celebration with a cup of Milo, a biscuit and a marshmallow which will be swapped for a non-perishable pantry item. These items will go to fill up the pantry for our local St Vinnie's who are supporting those in our local community that need a helping hand. **FAITH IN**

ACTION

The **Rosary** is a Catholic form of prayer using beads. It is a cycle of repeated formal prayers, such as the Lord's Prayer and the Hail Mary, done while thinking about important events in the lives of Jesus and Mary.

There are 20 stories/events in the Rosary cycle beginning with The Annunciation, when the Angel Gabriel tells Mary she will be the Mother of Jesus. On Friday we will focus on the fifth story/event about Jesus in the temple. Mary, Joseph and Jesus came to Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover festival, a very important annual Jewish festival that celebrates when Moses brought the slaves out of Egypt. They walked with many people from Nazareth to Jerusalem to the festival. On the way home they realised that Jesus was not with them and went back to find him. They found him in the temple 3 days later. He was only a young boy, but he was talking with the elders in the temple with great wisdom. His parents were very worried but relieved to find him. He told them that he was doing the work his Father in heaven told him to do.
